STATE FAIR OF TEXAS ANIMAL HEALTH SUMMARY OF REQUIREMENTS

Effective: January, 2021

THESE REGULATIONS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE AT ANY TIME.

The following summary is a condensed version of the Texas Animal Health Commission regulations. The regulations will supersede this summary if there is a dispute between the two. FOR MORE INFORMATION, contact the Texas Animal Health Commission by calling (512) 719-0777 (24 hours) or 1(800) 550-8242, ext. 777, or by writing the TAHC, P.O. Box 12966, Austin, TX 78711-2966.

The State Fair of Texas® Youth Livestock Shows are restricted to intrastate entries. The Pan-American Livestock Exposition® and State Fair of Texas Horse Shows are open, interstate shows, accepting entries of livestock, equine and poultry from within Texas, other states, and other countries.

<u>Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:</u> The certificate must indicate that the accredited veterinarian found the animals or fowl to be free of symptoms or evidence of communicable disease and that all tests, immunizations or treatments required by the Commission were completed. For certain diseases, a specific statement may be required indicating disease free status. The certificate is required to accompany animals and fowl entering the State of Texas and Fair Park as stated in the following summary of entry requirements.

THE CERTIFICATE IS VALID FOR 30 DAYS FOR ALL SPECIES.

<u>Prior Entry Permit:</u> Entry permits are required as noted in the following summary of entry requirements. Permits may be obtained by calling (512) 719-0777 (24 hours) or 1(800) 550-8242, ext. 777, or by writing TAHC, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, TX 78711-2966. The permit for entry is not required when exotic livestock and ratites enter for the exhibition and return to the state of origin. All poultry entering Texas must be permitted.

CATTLE (BEEF & DAIRY)

Texas Origin Breeding Cattle

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Youth Market and Prospect Steers do NOT require a CVI.
- 3. All dairy cattle must be identified with official ID and recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- **4.** Any bulls changing ownership must have a negative trichomoniasis test within 60 days; with an exception of virgin stamp on health certificates (CVI). (Does not apply to exhibition only Bulls)

Out-of-State Origin Cattle

- 1. Must meet the same requirements as Texas Origin Breeding Cattle.
- 2. Negative tuberculosis (TB) test within 60 days for all sexually intact dairy cattle that are 2 months of age or older or originate from an accredited tuberculosis free herd. In addition, all sexually intact dairy cattle originating from a state or area with anything less than a tuberculosis free state status shall be tested negative for tuberculosis in accordance with the appropriate requirements for states or areas for that status, prior to entry with results of the test recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 3. All bulls entering Texas for the purpose of participating at fairs, shows, exhibitions and/or rodeos and returning to the state of origin, which are more than (12) months of age and capable of breeding may enter the state without testing for trichomoniasis, but shall obtain a permit prior to entry into the state. Bulls permitted for entry into the State of Texas under the provisions of this subsection shall not be commingled with female cattle or used for breeding. Bulls that stay in the state more than sixty (60) days must be tested negative for trichomoniasis with one official Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test.
- 4. The Permit for Entry is not required when cattle enter for exhibition and return to the state of origin, except for exhibition bulls that do not meet TAHC's Trich entry Requirements.
- 5. All sexually intact cattle entering Texas for exhibition purposes and originating from Idaho, Montana or Wyoming must be officially identified and must have a statement on the certificate of veterinary inspection that the animals have never resided in the DSA. Types of official identification:
 - a. Official Alpha-numeric USDA metal ear tags (bangs tags)
 - **b.** Official Alpha-numeric USDA metal vaccination tags
 - c. Official 840 of 900 RFID tags (900 series tags are no longer official if applied to the animal after March 11, 2015)
 - d. Official 840 flap or bangle tags
 - e. Official individual animal breed registry tattoos or brands
 - f. National Dairy Fair Tag or Dairy Herd improvement Association Tag

EQUINE

Texas Origin Equine

- 1. Negative equine infectious anemia (EIA) test (also known as "Coggins Test") within 12 (twelve) months. In state origin equine: foals, under eight months of age, nursing a negative dam are exempt from testing. Test document must be in hand or test results and related information must be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 2. Pre-Fair: August 1-September 20, 2019
 - Exhibitors showing between the dates of August 1 Sept. 22, are required to provide a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, ONLY, if a horse originates within a 50 mile radius of a specific location that has been identified/quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis VS/EHV1. An EIA test is still REQUIRED for all horses.
- 3. Fair time: September 23-October 20, 2019
 - A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, and issued within 30 days, and an EIA test is REQUIRED.

Out of State Origin Equine

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, issued within 30 (thirty) days or a current, valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card, issued within 6 (six) months.
- 2. Must meet the same requirements as for Texas Origin Equine.

GOATS

Texas Origin Goats & Out of State Origin Goats

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Texas All sexually intact exhibition goats must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program eartag prior to entry, except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers.
- 3. Out of State All exhibition goats must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program eartag prior to entry, except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers along with a scrapie premise ID number.

Youth Market Goats

Youth Market Goats are NOT required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

LLAMAS (Camelidae)

Refer to Exotic Livestock and Ratites

POULTRY

Texas Origin Poultry

- 1. Negative pullorum-typhoid test within 30 (thirty) days or from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP).
- Poultry must originate from areas where reportable avian diseases are not known to have been active within the last 30 (thirty) days.

Out of State Origin Poultry

1. NO OUT OF STATE POULTRY ENTRIES PERMITTED.

Youth Market Broilers

1. Youth Market Broilers are NOT required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

<u>SHEEP</u>

Texas Origin Sheep

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. All sexually intact exhibition sheep must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program eartag.

Out of State Origin Sheep

- 1. Must meet the same requirements as for Texas Origin Sheep.
- 2. All exhibition sheep must be officially identified with a Scrapie Eradication Program eartag prior to entry.
- 3. Negative ELISA brucella ovis test within 30 (thirty) days for all breeding rams 6 months of age or older. Each ram shall be individually identified with an individual eartag or registration tattoo. This number, along with the test results and name of the approved laboratory and date of test, shall be entered on the certificate of veterinary inspection.

Youth Market Lambs

Youth Market Lambs are NOT required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

SWINE

Texas Origin Swine

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days listing identification and including a statement that
 they have not been fed garbage, have not been exposed to pseudorabies, have not been vaccinated for pseudorabies, and have not originated from a premises known to be affected by Novel Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease(s)
 (SECD), and have not been exposed to SECD within the last 30 days.
- Leptospirosis vaccination is required on breeding swine, 6 months of age and older, within 30 (thirty) days with Leptospirosis vaccine containing the following strains: Canicola, Hardjo, Icterohaemorrhagiae, Grippotoyphosa, and Pomona.

Out of State Origin Swine

- 1. Must meet the same requirements as Texas Origin Swine.
- 2. Permanent Identification is required on all swine except swine designated to slaughter.

Youth Market Swine

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is desirable, but not required for this terminal show. All youth market swine entering the grounds must be in good health and disease free.

EXOTIC LIVESTOCK AND RATITES

Exotic Livestock are defined as grass-eating or plant-eating, single hooved or cloven-hooved mammals that are not indigenous to this state and are known as ungulates, including animals from the swine, horse, tapir, camel, llama, rhinoceros, elephant, deer, and antelope families.

Camelidae are defined as members of the family of animals which include camel, llamas, and vicunas. The domestic members of the genus lama include the llama, alpaca, and guanaco.

Ratites are defined as exotic fowl with a flat breast-bone and small or nonexistent wings, such as ostriches, emu, rheas, and kiwi.

Exotic bovidae are defined as non-indigenous members of the family of animals which includes water buffalo, gnu (wildebeest), addax, antelope and nilgai (among others).

Exotic cervidae are defined as non-indigenous members of the family of animals which includes deer, elk, moose, caribou, reindeer and the sub-family musk deer.

Texas Origin Camelidae

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.

Texas Origin Ratites

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Individually identified with an implanted electronic device (microchip), tag or band. The identification will be shown on the certificate of veterinary inspection along with the location and name brand of the implanted electronic device. If an animal has more than one implanted microchip, then the location, microchip number, and name brand of each will be documented on the certificate of veterinary inspection; and
- 3. Tested and found to be serologically negative for Avian Influenza and Salmonella pullorum-typhoid from a sample collected within 30 days of entry. Birds or hatching eggs must originate from flocks that show no evidence of infectious disease and have no history of Avian Influenza in the past six months.

Texas Origin Exotic Bovidae

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within the past 30 (thirty) days.
- 3. Negative tuberculosis test within the past 60 (sixty) days.

Texas Origin Exotic Cervidae

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within the past 30 (thirty) days.
- 3. TWO Negative tuberculosis tests conducted no less than 90 (ninety) days apart the second test must be conducted within 90 (ninety) days prior to the date of movement; and the animals must be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period, or;
 - a. Originate from an accredited free herd, or;
 - b. Originated from a qualified herd and have a classified negative 90 (ninety) day tuberculosis test. If the qualifying herd test was administered within 90 (ninety) days of movement, the animal(s) do not require an additional test, or;
 - c. Originate from a monitored herd and have a classified negative 90 (ninety) day tuberculosis test, or;

d. Be less than 12 (twelve) months of age, originate and were born in accredited, qualified, or monitored herds and have not been exposed to cervids from a lower status.

Texas Origin Exotic Swine

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current, within 30 (thirty) days.
- 2. Negative brucellosis test within the past 30 (thirty) days or originate from a validated free herd.
- 3. Negative pseudorabies test within the past 30 (thirty) days or originate from a qualified free herd.

Out of State Origin Exotic Livestock and Ratites

1. Must meet the same requirements as Texas Origin Exotic Livestock and Ratites.

DOGS

<u>DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS</u> because of safety and public health regulations. This rule will be strictly enforced and applies to exhibitors and their employees, as well as to State Fair visitors. This rule does not apply to official dog entries in a sanctioned State Fair of Texas competitive and/or entertainment event or to guide dogs for those with sight impairment. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection current within 30 days is required to accompany all dogs eligible to enter Fair Park. Certificate must state that the dog has had a rabies vaccination within 1 year.

GENERAL INFORMATION & RULES

WELCOME: The State Fair of Texas ("State Fair") welcomes you to Dallas. We encourage you to participate in all the activities that this year's annual fair and exposition (the "Fair") has to offer. The State Fair staff looks forward to hosting you and your exhibits at the 2021 State Fair of Texas at Fair Park.

FAIR DATES: The 2021 Fair will be held at Fair Park in Dallas, Texas, from September 24, 2021 to October 17, 2021, unless postponed, shortened or extended by the Board of Directors, which they reserve the right to do if necessary for the safety and general welfare of all concerned.

HOMELAND SECURITY/EMERGENCY EVACUATION OF LIVESTOCK/PROPERTY STATEMENT: During such time as deemed necessary by local, state or federal authorities, State Fair, and/or its officials may, temporarily or permanently, evacuate Fair Park under the authority of the Homeland Security Act. Incidents such as, but not limited to, extreme weather conditions, pandemics or other health emergencies, bomb threats, terrorist acts, acts of war, declarations of war, code red of the Homeland Security System, etc., will be acted upon in accordance and cooperation with local, state and federal authorities. Priority evacuation will be given to human life, then livestock and/or property. In such cases, exhibitors may turn over the care of their livestock or property to State Fair, or as directed by governmental authorities. Proper animal husbandry practices will be followed within reasonable expectations, as the circumstances dictate. At such time the evacuation notice is lifted, exhibitors will be allowed to re-enter Fair Park and claim their livestock or property.

INTERPRETATION OF RULES: State Fair reserves to its Board of Directors the final and absolute right to interpret these General Information and Rules, the Youth Livestock Show Special Rules, and/or any applicable special requirements as published in this exhibitor handbook (collectively, the "Rules") and to reasonably settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Fair, and the right to amend or add to these Rules as its judgment may determine. An exhibitor who violates any of the Rules may forfeit all privileges, fees paid and premiums awarded and may be subject to such penalties as the Board of Directors may determine. The failure of State Fair to enforce any of the Rules or any of its rights or remedies thereunder, or to exercise any options or sanctions therein provided, will in no way be construed to be a waiver of such Rules, rights, remedies, sanctions or options. Special rules or conditions are published in each department where necessary. If there is a conflict between the special rules or requirements of any department or division and these general rules and regulations, the special rules or requirements shall apply. In addition, any breed association rules or third-party organization's rules that are observed in the competitions, are subject to and superseded by State Fair's Rules, where applicable.

LIABILITY STATEMENT: All exhibitors and exhibits shall comply with these Rules. State Fair shall not be liable to exhibitor for lost profit or other financial loss of any type or description including any special, indirect, reliance, incidental or consequential damages which may be caused directly or indirectly by the enforcement of these Rules, or for any time delays, inadequacies of services of State Fair or any use of the premises or by any deficiency or defect therein. Additionally, State Fair is not responsible for any loss, injury or damage caused by exhibitor or exhibitor's property that may arise directly or indirectly from exhibitor's participation at the Fair. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any such loss, injury or damage, whether to person or property, and shall indemnify the State Fair, City of Dallas, Fair Park First, Global Spectrum, L.P. d/b/a Spectra Venue Management, and their respective officers, directors, employees, elected and appointed officials, licensees, volunteers, contractors, representatives, managers, agents, principals, successors and assigns, from and against all losses, damages, costs and legal proceedings arising therefrom.

DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES: State Fair expressly disclaims any express or implied warranties (including warranty of merchantability), whether the goods or services are provided by State Fair, its contractors or others (such as drug testing). State Fair does not provide special security or guard services for the livestock area and is not responsible for the acts of third parties. Exhibitor (and exhibitor's parent or legal guardian, if exhibitor is a minor) agrees and acknowledges that State Fair will disqualify any exhibitor whose animal tests positive for ANY drug, even if the exhibitor (and the exhibitor's parent(s)/guardian) are innocent of any wrongdoing and had no role in the administration of the drug indicated by the drug test. Even if the source of the drug is unknown, State Fair shall be entitled to disqualify the exhibitor. Disqualification will result in the forfeiture of all auction proceeds and/or premiums, and the exhibitor may be prohibited from participating in future State Fair shows and competitions.

COVID-19 WARNING, RULES AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RISK:

a. The novel coronavirus commonly known as COVID-19 and SARS-CoV-2 ("COVID-19") has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists in any public place where people are present, including State Fair's livestock events at State Fair's facilities at Fair Park. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to potentially life threatening illness and even death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC"), senior citizens and persons with underlying

medical conditions are especially vulnerable.

- b. All Exhibitors, their family members and other related persons participating in the livestock events at State Fair's facilities (collectively, "Participants") shall comply with State Fair's health and safety guidelines related to COVID-19 as by the CDC, State of Texas, County of Dallas and/or City of Dallas. While best practices for prevention of transmission and infection of COVID-19 continue to evolve, the State Fair reserves the right to require Participants to wear personal protective equipment ("PPE"), wash hands frequently, use hand sanitizer or antibacterial wipes, maintain social distancing, and submit to non-invasive body temperature measurement or COVID-19 testing.
- c. Participants acknowledge that PPE designed to reduce the chances of exposure to or infection with COVID-19 may not be readily available at State Fair's facilities. Participants acknowledge that State Fair may not, and is under no legal duty to, provide any PPE to Participants. Participants should provide their own PPE for participation in the State Fair livestock events.
- d. Participants understand and acknowledge that participation in the State Fair livestock events or use of State Fair's facilities may expose them to contact with one or more persons who have been infected with, and/or exposed to, COVID-19. Participants further acknowledge that participation in the State Fair livestock events or use of the facilities may expose them to contact with surfaces or objects that contain the COVID-19 and may serve as a means for transmission of COVID-19 to others who participate in the livestock events or use the facilities. Based on the forgoing, Participants understand and acknowledge that participation in the State Fair livestock events and use of the facilities may expose them, along with others with whom they may come in contact after they leave State Fair's facilities, to a risk of infection with COVID-19, which may cause significant and serious illness, bodily injury, disfigurement, temporary or permanent disability, and/or death.
- **e.** Participants are encouraged to receive one of the U.S. Federal Drug Administration approved COVID-19 vaccines, including any boosters, prior to arrival at State Fair's facilities or participation in the State Fair livestock events.

VETERINARIANS/MEDICATIONS: Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking ANY type of medication, including but not limited to steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers and/or pain killers, are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors with questions regarding medications and/or eligibility should consult the Official State Fair Veterinarian prior to competition. Exhibitor (and exhibitor's parent or legal guardian, if exhibitor is a minor) agrees and acknowledges that: (1) they are absolutely and solely responsible for the care and custody of their animals; (2) State Fair shall be entitled to disqualify an exhibitor whose animal(s) test positive for ANY medication, even if the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents/guardians are innocent of any wrongdoing and did not administer the medication; and (3) the drug test results of the testing laboratories are final and binding upon the exhibitor and the exhibitor's parents/guardians.

PRESS INFORMATION: Members of State Fair's Publicity Staff will be glad to furnish any information requested by representatives of newspapers, magazines, radio and television stations. Results of judging will be furnished as quickly as reasonably possible. All reasonable cooperation and assistance will be given to representatives of the working press covering the State Fair. Facilities for the working press will be available through the State Fair's Public Relations Department.

FIREARMS: A person holding a valid Texas License to Carry a Handgun ("LTC"), or a valid concealed handgun license from a reciprocating state, is permitted to enter the fairgrounds with his or her concealed handgun, provided that he or she thereafter fully complies with all applicable laws. LTC holders are responsible for knowing and complying with all applicable Texas laws. For example, under Texas Penal Code Section 46.035 an LTC holder is prohibited from carrying a concealed handgun: (1) inside the Cotton Bowl, Livestock Barns or on any other premises where a high school, collegiate, or professional sporting event or interscholastic event is taking place, (2) on the premises of a business that derives 51 percent or more of its income from the sale or service of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption, or (3) while intoxicated. State Fair prohibits Fair attendees (including LTC holders) from openly carrying handguns while at the Fair. If an individual attempts to enter the Fair with an openly carried handgun, he or she will not be allowed to enter the Fair unless he or she conceals the handgun (if he or she has a valid LTC) or secures the handgun in his or her vehicle or at some off-site location. If an LTC holder enters the Fair with a concealed handgun and then begins to openly carry the handgun, he or she will be asked to either conceal the handgun or to leave the Fair.

FIRE REGULATIONS: Smoking is prohibited in and around buildings in Fair Park, regardless of whether such building is open air or enclosed. No containers containing flammable liquids will be allowed in any buildings.

GUEST ASSISTANCE: It is the intent of State Fair to welcome all visitors and treat them with courtesy and respect. Should guests experience any problems with a State Fair employee or vendor, these concerns should be reported immediately to State Fair's Guest Relations or State Fair management, so that the matter can be addressed before the Fair concludes.

FIRST AID STATION: State Fair will maintain a completely equipped First Aid Station staffed by registered nurses, paramedics and/or emergency medical technicians to provide emergency treatment and facilities for injuries and illnesses oc-

curring during the Fair. The First Aid Station is located on the Southwest side of Fair Park Coliseum. Call (214) 421-8818 for assistance. Management assumes no responsibility for accidents in Fair Park.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. **NON-ADHERENCE TO THE RULES:** Any person found guilty of misrepresentation, fraud or not abiding by the Rules (whether in this exhibitor handbook, or otherwise) will be disqualified and denied the privilege of competing at the Fair.
- 2. SIGNED LIABILITY STATEMENT: Each exhibitor/contestant (and exhibitor's parent or legal guardian, if exhibitor is a minor) must sign a statement acknowledging that he/she understands and agrees to the release and/or limitation of liability statement and agrees to abide by all Rules of State Fair. If the exhibitor does not sign this statement (contained on all entry application forms), application for entry will be rejected.
- 3. ENTRY ELIGIBILITY: The State Fair does not discriminate against any applicant, exhibitor, volunteer, customer or patron on the basis of race, sex, color, age, disability, religion, citizenship, veteran status, nationality or ethnic origin. Competition in all Pan American Livestock Exposition (open show) classes is open to the public, except where stated in this exhibitor handbook. Competition in Youth Livestock Show and Contest classes is restricted. Refer to the Youth Livestock Show Special Rules for entry eligibility. Youth Show exhibitors are permitted to enter the Open Show when an additional entry application and entry fee is submitted by the entry deadline. Only animals officially entered will be allowed on the fairgrounds during their scheduled time (see individual competition Rules).
 - **a. TAXPAYER IDENTIFICATION:** Any exhibitor eligible for premiums MUST complete an IRS Form W-9 and return it with entry applications.
 - b. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Exhibitors and their exhibits must meet and adhere to the requirements of these Rules and any and all Special Rules listed under the appropriate department(s) and division(s) as printed in this exhibitor handbook to be eligible for entry.
 - c. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** Please refer to the Animal Health Requirements listed in this exhibitor handbook.
 - **d. FIRMS AND PARTNERSHIPS:** Firms and partnerships entering animals for competition must be in existence at the time of making entry and, in all cases, must be bona fide legal entities.
 - e. REGISTRATION/CHECK-IN: All animals in the breeding classes must be recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds and exhibitors must produce an original certificate of registry at check-in and at the request of the management at any time during the Fair. Stamped duplicate applications, copies, or electronic versions will NOT be accepted at any time. Tattoos, ear tags or other identification marks must match registration certificates. See applicable special Rules.
 - f. OWNERSHIP: To be eligible for competition, whether singly or in groups, animals must be the bona fide property of the owner. If proof of ownership is required, a sworn affidavit must be furnished. Jointly owned animals must be listed as so. In the group classes, jointly owned animals may be entered and exhibited under the name of one of the co-owners provided he/she owns a full or part interest in each of the animals in the group entry where eligible.

4. INELIGIBLE TO ENTER:

- a. DISQUALIFIED EXHIBITORS: State Fair reserves the right to refuse entry of any contestant for violation of these Rules. Contestants who previously have been disqualified from State Fair shows will not be allowed entry until such time as expressed in the penalties handed down by the State Fair Board has expired.
- b. DISEASED ANIMALS: Diseased animals cannot enter the State Fair livestock facilities or fairgrounds. Animal Health officials, superintendents, the official State Fair veterinarian, and/or State Fair management will refuse unloading privileges to animals showing signs and symptoms of disease.
- **c. BARREN ANIMALS:** Barren animals are not eligible for breeding classes. An affidavit verifying the animal is a breeder must be furnished upon request.

5. ENTRY PROCEDURE:

- a. **ENTRY APPLICATION:** All applications for entry must be made on current, official State Fair of Texas entry application forms in accordance with their instructions, providing division, class, and all other necessary information. Pan American exhibitors must complete all entries online at livestock.bigtex.com. All youth entries, including contests, must be submitted online by the CEA/AST (see Youth Livestock Show Special Rules).
- b. **GROUP ENTRIES:** Group classes are denoted by a "G" after the class number. An entry fee is required for all group classes. Each exhibitor is permitted only one entry per group class. Late group class entries will not be accepted after check-in deadline. All animals entered in a group class must be shown in their individual age class.
- c. DOUBLE ENTRIES: If the exhibitor chooses to show in both the youth & open shows, separate fees are required.
- d. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE: In all cases, State Fair management reserves the right to reject, accept, or accept conditionally an application for entry and does not guarantee space in the exhibition buildings. Rejected entries may be returned to the applicant.
- e. ENTRY SUBSTITUTIONS: Entry substitutions may be made within the same show, same breed and by the same owner of the original entry. Substitutions may be made after the entry deadline by submitting a substitution form and a processing fee of \$20 (each entry). No substitutions will be allowed after check-in deadline.
- f. ERRONEOUS ENTRIES: At the discretion of State Fair management, exhibits that have been erroneously entered may be transferred to their proper classes prior to judging. Management will decide the disposition of each

- case of erroneous entry upon its merits.
- g. INCOMPLETE ENTRIES: Incomplete entries are defined as entries made by entry deadline (online or mailed) but are missing signatures, W-9's, payment, or other required information and may be accepted conditionally by State Fair. Incomplete entries are subject to additional fees. (See miscellaneous fees.) State Fair may reject any late/incomplete entry without explanation.
- h. ENTRIES NOT CHECKED IN UPON ARRIVAL: If an exhibitor fails to check in by the published deadline, the entry is ineligible to compete.
- i. **EXHIBITOR LATE ARRIVAL**: If an exhibitor fails to arrive within designated arrival time/before arrival deadline, the entry is ineligible to compete.
- 6. ENTRY DEADLINES: All youth entries must be postmarked by postal/shipping service no later than September 1. Postal meter date is not acceptable.
 - a. Youth Livestock and Contest entries must be submitted <u>online by 11:59PM, August 25, by CEA/AST.</u>
 **The following <u>must also be postmarked on or before September 1</u>, (in addition to online submission) to be considered complete YOUTH entries:
 - i. One check per county/chapter, credit card payments also accepted and encouraged;
 - ii. Each exhibitor's entry worksheet(s);
 - iii. One W-9 per exhibitor;
 - iv. One Release and Liability Signature form per each exhibitor or team; and
 - v. All required supplemental contest materials uploaded with all signatures (by September 1).
 - b. Pan American Livestock, Rabbit, and Poultry entry deadline September 1.
 - i. Pan American entries must be completed **entirely** online.
 - ii. Online entry process includes making entry, signing indemnity form, W9, and paying online.
 - iii. Do not mail hard copies.
- 7. ENTRY FEES: All applications for entry must be accompanied by related fees. If the entry does not have fees enclosed, the application for entry will not be accepted or may be accepted conditionally. All international exhibitors must pay fees in certified U.S. currency. Entry fees are not stall fees and do not dictate stall space.

- **a.** Entry fees for competitive events are refundable when written notification of cancellation is postmarked <u>prior</u> to the applicable entry deadline.
- **b.** Admission and parking pass fees are refundable when written notification of cancellation, along with all distributed credentials is received prior to the opening day of the Fair.
- c. All refund requests must be made for amounts greater than \$20.
- **d.** Refunds will be forwarded to the entry applicant after the closing of the Fair. All refunds are payable by check. All refunds, whatsoever, not claimed within 90 days upon receipt, shall be deemed forfeited to State Fair.

COMPETITION

16. JUDGES/OFFICIALS:

- **a. SELECTION OF JUDGES/OFFICIALS:** Judges will be selected by State Fair management. Judges will be familiar with all Rules and department requirements.
- b. JUDGES' DECISIONS/OFFICIALS: The judges' decisions are final.
- c. INTERFERENCE WITH JUDGES/OFFICIALS: If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows disrespect to the judges or show officials, State Fair management may excuse the exhibitor from the ring, disqualify him/her from further competition, and any exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be forfeited.

17. PROTESTS:

- a. FILING: All protests must be on an official protest form obtainable from the State Fair livestock office and accompanied by a deposit of \$300.00, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to State Fair management immediately after the occasion for such protest. Protests will be accepted prior to, during and within twelve (12) hours immediately following the conclusion of judging the competition.
- **b. INVESTIGATION:** Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. State Fair reserves the right to hold all protests and investigation findings confidential.

18. SHOW RING COMPETITION:

- a. **HUMANE TREATMENT:** Exhibitors are to treat animals in a humane manner at all times. Show officials will provide a warning to any exhibitor deemed to be in violation of this basic principle of animal husbandry. Any exhibitor who fails to heed the warning will be disqualified and removed from the fairgrounds. Show instruments (i.e.: show sticks, driving sticks, bats, halters, etc.) are to be used for the purpose of directing animals while they are in transit throughout the barnd and while they are being exhibited in the show ring.
- **b. ANIMAL HANDLING DEVICES:** State Fair management reserves the right to decide what constitutes acceptable show equipment and how the equipment is used by the exhibitor. Cable halters are prohibited for all species.
- c. COMMUNICATION DEVICES: NO electronic/communication devices are allowed in the show ring. This includes cell phones, smart watches, tablets, PDAs, laptops, walkie-talkies, and any other communication devices.
- d. ENTRY NUMBER: Entry number must be displayed/worn by exhibitors when exhibiting in the show ring.
- e. METHOD OF AWARDING: No animal will be awarded a prize unless removed from its stall or pen and exhibited, with entry number, before the judge(s) in the designated show ring. State Fair management reserves the right to return entries and cancel any class in which, in its judgment, the number of entries are insufficient to ensure adequate competition. Where there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered, the judge(s) may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animal merits.
- f. TIME OF JUDGING: The Livestock Show Schedule, as published in this exhibitor handbook, will be followed as closely as possible. Exhibitors should ascertain at what time the exhibits entered will be judged. Judging will not be delayed for exhibitors entering the show ring late. Any exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time will be ruled out and excluded from competition when the class is called.
- g. JUDGING CONTESTS: When an exhibitor is called upon to furnish one or more animals for any judging contest(s), he or she will cooperate with State Fair management. Refusing to allow an animal to be used in this manner, without State Fair management's approval, will result in the forfeiture of any prizes or such other action as State Fair management deems necessary. Selection will be made under the direction of the department superintendent(s).
- h. **DISQUALIFICATION:** If an exhibit is disqualified there will be no refund of any fees due to disqualification.
- i. **UNWORTHY EXHIBIT:** Judges shall not award a prize to an unworthy exhibit. It is the intent of State Fair that no premium or distinction of any kind be given to any exhibit that is not deserving.
- 19. PHOTOGRAPHS/VIDEOS: Photographs of Champion and Reserve Champion exhibits will be taken by the official photographer of the State Fair. Exhibitors of Champion and Reserve Champion winners must make themselves and

their exhibits available for the official photographs with the possibility of videos. Exhibitor hereby grants State Fair permission to utilize photographs/videos, image or likeness in whole or in part for use in official State Fair publications, social media, webcasts and other promotions.

20. PREMIUM PAYOUT: Total premiums will be paid by State Fair unless otherwise stated. Premiums will be forwarded to designated person(s) as directed, after the close of the Fair as they can properly be processed. Premiums are payable by check. Checks will be made payable to the exhibitor listed on the entry form. All premiums whatsoever, not claimed within 90 days upon receipt, shall be deemed forfeited to State Fair. State Fair reserves the right to withhold premiums awarded in every case in which it appears to State Fair management that the Rules have been violated, or that fraud or deception has been attempted or practiced.

COMPETITION EXHIBITS

- 21. HEALTH REQUIREMENT: All animals entering Fair Park must comply with the requirements as determined by the State Fair and the Texas Animal Health Commission ("TAHC"). TAHC reserves the right to modify requirements at any time. If needed, State Fair requirements may exceed TAHC's requirements.
- 22. STALLS: Stall space will only be assigned for animals that arrive on the fairgrounds. Animals entered, but not arriving on the fairgrounds will not receive stall space or first bedding. Special and specific stall requests, when applicable, must be submitted on the Stall Request Form by entry deadline. There is no guarantee that any stall request can or will be honored.
 - a. STALLING UPON ARRIVAL: Entries including, but not limited to, all market animals, beef cattle and gilts are stalled upon arrival. To pen together, groups MUST arrive together at the staging area. No pen assignments will be made for animals in trailers coming later. Animals will be counted upon arrival. Livestock officials reserve the right to deny stall requests.
- 23. BEDDING: Stalls will be pre-bed upon arrival or exhibitors will be provided a coupon from the show superintendent that may be redeemed for first bedding material through the State Fair Feed Store on the fairgrounds on the day of arrival only. No outside bedding (including but not limited to bagged or baled wood shavings or chips, cedar fiber and small square baled straw) will be permitted on the fairgrounds. Equivalents will be available from the State Fair Feed Store.
- 24. TIE OUTS: A limited number of tie out spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. Tie outs may be purchased at time of entry or from the Livestock Office post arrival deadline, pending availability. Tie outs will be assigned upon arrival when the proof of purchase is confirmed. All cattle in tie-outs MUST wear a neck-tie. Cattle are limited to the assigned tie-out areas. Straw is the only permitted bedding in tie outs. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning before/ after use, as necessary.
- **25. FEED/HAY:** Feed grains of all types and hay will be available, at reasonable prices, through the State Fair Feed Store on the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are not allowed to bring large quantities of feed or hay onto the fairgrounds. However, exhibitors who must use their own feed will be allowed to bring the feed on the fairgrounds in limited amounts daily.
- 26. ANIMAL/EXHIBITOR DISQUALIFICATION: In order to foster fair competition, provide a level playing field and protect the safety of the food chain, the showing of unethically fitted livestock, animals with any type of abscess, injury or deemed unhealthy, livestock of ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered, and/or animals being administered unapproved drugs is strictly prohibited. Additionally, any animal that has been administered a drug, even though that drug is FDA approved for its species, is subject to disqualification if that animal tests positive for that drug once it has arrived at the Fair and/or participated in State Fair shows. All animals must remain negative/clear of all drug and chemical residues while on State Fair fairgrounds.
 - **a. EXHIBITOR FORFEITURE:** An exhibitor of an animal that is found to be unethically fitted, over age, and/or testing positive for any drug or medication or unapproved substance may forfeit all titles, awards, auction proceeds, premiums, scholarships, as well as rights and privileges to exhibit livestock in the future at the Fair.
 - b. UNETHICAL FITTING: Unethical fitting means any attempt to alter the natural appearance, conformation, musculature or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. Animals showing any signs of being unethically fitted will be disqualified. Examples of unethical fitting include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Application of any substance to any part of the animal's body, unless specifically allowed in the department rules of that entry
 - Use of injection(s)
 - · Draining of fluids
 - Bruising
 - Feeding of material not conducive to the health of the animal, safety of food or marketability of its carcass
 - Surgical alterations
 - Artificially filling animals by stomach pumping or airing injections
 - **c. OVER AGE ANIMALS:** Over age animals will be disqualified. Exhibitor agrees that the opinion reached by State Fair or its officials as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age shall be final and binding without recourse against State Fair, its officials or any of its appointed veterinarians.

- d. UNAPPROVED DRUG USE: The showing of an animal that during its life has been administered any quantity of any unapproved drug, chemical or medication is strictly prohibited. Such drugs include, but are not limited to, any diuretic, unapproved growth stimulant or other unapproved medication. Unapproved means not approved by the U.S. Food & Drug Administration ("FDA") and/or the U.S. Department of Agriculture ("USDA") for slaughter animals of a species, including animals that may be destined for human consumption.
- e. APPROVED DRUG USE: If an animal has been administered a drug that is FDA approved for its species, sufficient time must have passed so that the drug has been completely eliminated from the animal's system, and the animal does not test positive for that drug upon arrival at the State Fair fairgrounds. Animals must remain free and clear of all drug and chemical residues while on State Fair property and/or participating in State Fair shows. Please note that elimination time (the time it takes for no drug residue to be found in the system) is generally longer than the labeled withdrawal time for most approved drugs.
- f. ANIMAL INSPECTION: As a condition for participation in the State Fair shows, exhibitor agrees to submit any animal entered by the exhibitor for inspection by any veterinarian or show official appointed by State Fair management. Exhibitor also agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests requested by State Fair. Further, State Fair specifically reserves the right to have ultrasound, D.N.A., tissue, blood, urine, hair and feather laboratory analysis made on any animal entered for State Fair competition. The conclusions reached by the veterinarian or laboratory shall be final and binding without recourse against State Fair, its officials or any of its appointed veterinarians. Exhibitor waives any cause of action which he/she might have for any action taken under these Rules, and releases State Fair and any appointed veterinarian from any and all claims or demands whatsoever in connection with the inspection or testing of any such animal or any ruling or action taken by reason of the conclusion of such veterinarian.
- g. UNMANAGEABLE ANIMALS: State Fair may disqualify any animal deemed unmanageable. Any animal escaping the control of its exhibitor three times or more will be dismissed from the show ring.
- h. DISQUALIFICATION/CONDEMNATION OF ANIMAL: State Fair practices a "ZERO TOLERANCE" policy on all residue violations. State Fair reserves the right to condemn and/or disqualify any animal, either live or slaughtered, found in violation of the Rules, and the exhibitor will forfeit all auction sale and/or premium money if the animal is disqualified. If an animal(s) is disqualified, other class placings will not change. A disqualified exhibitor may forfeit all rights and privileges to participate in future Fairs, as well as any and all State Fair scholarship opportunities. Disqualifications due to violations of State Fair's Rules as stated in this exhibitor handbook or the Livestock Entry Certification, and any consequences will be decided by State Fair management. These decisions may be appealed to State Fair's Board of Directors from whose decision there can be no further appeal.
- 27. OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN: State Fair contracts with veterinary professionals to be available on fairgrounds for the duration of the Fair. Please contact the State Fair's Livestock Office to make a request for an animal that needs medical attention
 - a. EMERGENCY TREATMENT: If an animal requires emergency treatment while on State Fair property, only a licensed veterinarian will be allowed to administer any drug, chemical or feed additive. An exhibitor may choose a licensed veterinarian other than the Official State Fair Veterinarian, but the Official State Fair Veterinarian MUST be notified in advance and he/she MUST be present. All animals which are administered treatments with a withdrawal or extended elimination time period will be disqualified from competition. The Official State Fair Veterinarian, in agreement with State Fair management, reserves the right to treat any animal if, in the opinion of the Official State Fair Veterinarian, it is in the best interest of the animal's health and well-being to be treated. If the Official State Fair Veterinarian administers treatment to an animal, and therefore uses any medication that does not meet the appropriate withdrawal and/or elimination time, such animal will be determined ineligible for competition.
 - b. TREATMENT COSTS: All treatment costs are the financial responsibility of the exhibitor.
 - c. CVI ISSUANCE: Exhibitors arriving to Fair Park without required health papers for animal(s) will not be permitted to enter the fairgrounds. Exhibitors will be designated to a temporary location until the SFT official veterinarian arrives and issues a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) at the cost of the exhibitor. Issuance of a CVI by the official show veterinarian is \$100, due at time of service.
- **28. POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS:** The City of Dallas and State Fair require a postmortem examination of any animal or poultry which dies during the Fair or on State Fair property. This examination must be performed by the Official State Fair Veterinarian at the expense of the exhibitor.
- **29. CONDUCT:** Any exhibitors or their representatives not cooperating with State Fair officials in all matters, while on State Fair property, will have their entries disqualified and may be ordered to remove their exhibit from the fairgrounds immediately and may lose the opportunity to participate in future competitions.
- **30. GROOMING:** Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color, except where stated otherwise in this exhibitor handbook. Any product used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, false hair, artificial color, adhesives, or other similar substances.
- 31. PUMPING: Artificially filling animals by stomach pumping per esophagus is strictly prohibited.
- 32. MUZZLES: Muzzles must be cloth, nylon or similar material. No metal muzzles.

- **33. DRENCHING:** Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited.
- **34. RELEASE:** Entries must be on exhibit at the official opening of the Fair or any other time specified in the exhibitor handbook and shall not be removed from the fairgrounds prior to the release date printed in the exhibitor handbook, except at the discretion of State Fair management.

DISPLAYS AND NON-LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

- **35. DISPLAYS:** Displays/exhibits will only be permitted when space is available. All facets of a display/exhibit must remain in assigned space and out of pedestrian aisles. All curtains, drapes, decorations, merchandise, or material must be Non-Combustible or Flame Proof. City of Dallas Fire Marshalls will inspect exhibits and ask you to remove any materials that they believe is a fire hazard.
- 36. CARE OF EXHIBITS/PROPERTY: All owners or others in charge of livestock, poultry, rabbits or other property shall care for, guard, protect and preserve the same. State Fair does not undertake to guard or protect exhibitor's livestock or property, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss, death or damage to said livestock, poultry, rabbits or property. State Fair does not provide special security services for the livestock area and is not responsible for the acts of third parties.
- **37. OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBITS:** State Fair management, in its sole and reasonable discretion, reserves the right to remove from the Fairgrounds any exhibit, animal, stand or display that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsafe, unsuitable or objectionable. State Fair will refund any money already paid by the removed exhibitor which shall exonerate State Fair from any and all claims whatsoever.
- **38. ADVERTISING:** No person will be permitted to distribute any literature, advertising or promotional materials on the fairgrounds, except from a valid contracted exhibit space authorized by State Fair. The tacking or posting of any advertisement, bills, etc., other than within an official State Fair exhibit space is strictly prohibited. The distribution of handbills, fliers and heralds will not be permitted. Exhibitor shall not be permitted to sell or distribute any promotional items or merchandise to State Fair patrons while on the fairgrounds.
- **39. CLEAN-UP:** All stalls, pens and exhibition places must be cleaned before 7:00AM each day and waste disposed of as directed by State Fair management. For those exhibitors refusing to keep their stalls, pens and/or exhibits clean and neat, State Fair management reserves the right to have the stalls or pens properly cleaned with the cost to be charged against the exhibitor. Such cost will be collected from the exhibitor before release is issued.
- **40. EQUIPMENT:** Any equipment brought in must be used in assigned stalls or space and must comply with and be used in compliance with all federal, state and municipal occupational safety and health regulations. Some equipment may require a special permit and a fee to be paid before being utilized on the fairgrounds.
 - a. ELECTRICAL CORDS AND WATER HOSES: All extension cords must be factory modeled (not repaired or altered), with a maximum of 25 feet and minimum gauge of 12. Water hoses should not leak. No cord or hose shall cross any aisle or walkway.
 - **b. SCALES:** State Fair will provide scales for the use of exhibitors during shows that classes are broken by weight. No other scales will be allowed on the fairgrounds.
 - c. FANS: No fans permitted in any pedestrian aisle, walkway or stall. No rear fans permitted. No exceptions. All fans must be hung using 'L' brackets. No Porta-cools or similar cooling devices allowed.
 - **d. GENERATORS:** City of Dallas Fire Prevention Code prohibits liquid or gas fired portable generators or other equipment in livestock facilities and in enclosed structure areas. No liquefied petroleum-fueled or flammable or combustible liquid-fuel generators or other devices will be allowed.
 - **e. STEREOS:** Excessively loud music and/or offensive is not permitted in or around the barns. Show management reserves the right to remove/prohibit any radio/stereo/audio or video equipment.
 - f. BBQ GRILLS/KITCHEN EQUIPMENT: No cooking devices including, but not limited, to crock-pots, coffee pots, or electric grills are permitted in or around the barns.
- **41. GROOMING/TRIM CHUTES:** Grooming chutes may be brought onto the fairgrounds provided an appropriate permit is purchased. (See special rules.) The fee is to be paid at the time entries are made. Space for chutes will be in stalls or outside cattle buildings. No chutes permitted in any pedestrian aisle or walkway.
- **42. DOGS:** Dogs are not allowed on the fairgrounds, except dogs under entertainment contract with State Fair, dogs competing in Sheep Dog Trials, or qualified service animals for persons with disabilities in accordance with wthe guidelines of the Americans with Disabilities Act (see https://www.ada.gov/service_animals_2010.htm)
- 43. NURSE COWS: Nurse cows are not allowed on the fairgrounds.
- **44. MOTORIZED VEHICLES:** Scooters, golf carts, motorized carts, ATVs or similar vehicles are not permitted on the fair-grounds for use by exhibitors. Such vehicles not authorized by the State Fair will be removed at the owner's expense.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK SHOW SPECIAL RULES

The State Fair of Texas ("State Fair") encourages a practical interest among young people in the responsibilities and practices of feeding and raising livestock and competing in agricultural contests. The purpose of the Youth Livestock Shows and Contests at the State Fair is to encourage and promote the educational aspects of agriculture/livestock projects conducted by youth exhibitors under the proper supervision and direction of an Agriculture Science Teacher (AST) or a County Extension Agent (CEA). State Fair recognizes that the Texas AgriLife Extension, through 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters and the Texas Education Agency, provide a valuable service to the public in educating Texas students in the principles of successful production livestock and agricultural knowledge. In order to encourage participation in the 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters throughout the state, State Fair includes as a part of its annual fair and exposition (the "Fair"), the youth livestock division which is a special exhibition for Texas 4-H and FFA members.

1. RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in the Youth Livestock Show and Contests shall be subject to and each contestant agrees to abide by the General Rules, Youth Livestock Show Special Rules, and any applicable special requirements as published in this exhibitor handbook (collectively, the "Rules"). In the event of any conflict between the Youth Livestock Show Special Rules and the General Rules, the provisions of these Special Rules shall apply. Additionally, any conflict between any additional special requirements and the Youth Livestock rules, the additional special rules shall apply.

2. PARTICIPATION:

- a. ELIGIBLE EXHIBITORS: Participation in the Youth Livestock Show is limited to Texas residents who:
 - i. are members of a Texas 4-H Club or Texas FFA Chapter (except where stated otherwise)
 - **ii.** have continuously owned and personally fed and cared for their project animal under the direct supervision of a CEA or AST
 - iii. are enrolled in, and attending, public, private or home school elementary or secondary schools in Texas
 - iv. have reached the age of 8 years old and are in the third grade (cannot be over 18 years old as of September 1)
 - v. are bona fide residents of the state of Texas
 - vi. are current 'QUALITY COUNTS' certified.

b. INELIGIBLE EXHIBITORS:

- i. If an exhibitor is suspended under the Texas Education Code 33.081 "No Pass, No Play", then that exhibitor/competitor and their animal are not eligible for competition.
- ii. Exhibitors who have been disqualified from competition at the State Fair of Texas or have had a premium withheld or withdrawn are not eligible for competition. This shall include, but is not limited to: disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting, tampering or deception. State Fair reserves the right to determine show eligibility.
- **iii.** Exhibitors who have had a Grand Champion market steer, market barrow, market lamb, market goat, or pen of market broilers at any prior State Fair Youth Livestock Show are not eligible to compete in the division in which their prior Grand Champion was exhibited.

3. ENTRY PROCEDURE:

- a. ENTRY APPLICATION: All entries must be submitted online at <u>livestock.bigtex.com</u> no later than 11:59PM, on August 25. In addition, complete entry applications, indemnities with all applicable signatures, W9s and payment must be submitted by AST/CEA online by credit card or with a school/county check, cashier's check, or money order and postmarked on or before September 1 to the State Fair of Texas, Livestock Office, PO Box 150009, Dallas, TX 75315.
- b. ENTRY CERTIFICATION: The Certification, Release, and Indemnity portion of each entry application must be signed by the youth exhibitor, a parent or guardian, AND the CEA/AST. By signing the certification, each party acknowledges that they have read, understood and will abide by all the Rules. Additionally, by signing the entry application, the youth exhibitor and the parent or guardian certify that the entry has not been administered any substance not approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and/or the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for food animals. Furthermore, the exhibitor and parent/guardian certifies that the entry is free and clear of ALL drug and chemical residue, regardless of whether such drug is FDA or USDA approved or whether the withdrawal or elimination periods have been met.
- c. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Health papers are not required on youth market animals. Health papers are required on animals entered in all breeding shows. See Animal Health Regulations in this exhibitor handbook.
- **d. CLUB/CHAPTER ENTRIES:** Entries made by 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters will only be accepted in Youth Dairy Herd classes and Contests where allowed.
- **e. ENTRY LIMITATIONS:** No exhibitor will be allowed to show more than one market steer, one market barrow, one market lamb, one market goat, or two pens of three market broilers each.
- f. INCOMPLETE ENTRIES: Incomplete entries include entries submitted online by 11:59PM, August 25, and post-marked by the deadline but are missing signatures, W-9's or other required information. Incomplete entries will be

accepted conditionally and will be assessed incomplete fee(s) on a case by case basis. Otherwise, the entry may be disqualified.

- g. LATE ENTRIES: Late entries are defined as entries not submitted online by 11:59PM, August 25 or not post-marked by September 1. Entries made after midnight on entry deadline must still be mailed to State Fair's Live-stock Office. See General Rules for late fees.
- 4. REGISTRATION: All animals in the breeding classes must be recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds and exhibitors must produce an original certificate of registry at the request of the management at any time during the Fair. Stamped duplicate applications, copies, or electronic versions will NOT be accepted at any time. Tattoos or other identification marks must match registration certificates. See applicable special rules.

5. OWNERSHIP:

- a. All animals must be exhibited, shown, and sold (in the Youth Livestock Auction when applicable) by their owner.
- b. The exhibitor must own their animal at the beginning of and throughout the feeding period and must feed, care for and exhibit their animal entered without any aid or assistance during the entire feeding period except from parents, CEA, AST or other youth exhibitors and leaders from their county/chapter. All youth animal exhibits must be owned and continuously cared for by the exhibitor from June 30 through the show date of the Fair. Exception: market broilers must be owned and continuously cared for from hatch date to the show date of the Fair. See validation requirements.
- c. JOINTLY OWNED ANIMALS: Animals owned in joint names are not eligible to compete, except where otherwise stated.
- d. SUBSTITUTE EXHIBITORS: At the sole and reasonable discretion of State Fair officials and the department superintendent, a substitute exhibitor may be used by submitting a substitute exhibitor form and meeting one of the following conditions:
 - When an exhibitor has more than one entry in the Youth Livestock Show showing at the same time; or
 - When an exhibitor is sick or injured (must be accompanied by a signed statement from a licensed medical doctor). Doctor's notes will be verified.

When one of the preceding conditions exists, a State Fair official may use his/her own discretion as to whether a substitute exhibitor will be allowed. If a favorable decision is rendered by the official, the substitute exhibitor must be from the same county/chapter as the original exhibitor. The substitute must also meet all requirements of a Youth Livestock Show exhibitor. If only one exhibitor is present from a county/chapter, an official can approve a substitute from another county/chapter. An exhibitor may be used as a substitute only one time per market department. An official will require positive identification of the substitute exhibitor and will require documentation for any of the above conditions. Substitute exhibitors must be verified by BOTH a State Fair official and department superintendent and forms must be turned in at Check-In/Weight Card turn in, and on file at the livestock office prior to show day.

- e. **TEXAS STATE VALIDATION:** Youth prospect steers, market steers, market lambs and goats, barrows, heifers, breeding sheep, breeding goats (except Angoras) and gilts must be validated through the respective channel for each species. Exhibitors need to check with their local CEA or AST for local/county validation deadlines. All State Fair of Texas required shows will adhere to the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- 6. STALLING UPON ARRIVAL: Entries including, but not limited to all market animals, beef cattle, and gilts are stalled upon arrival. To pen together, groups MUST arrive together at the staging area. No pen assignments will be made for animals in trailers coming later. Animals will be counted upon arrival. Livestock officials reserve the right to deny stall requests.
- 7. BEDDING: Stalls and pens will be pre-bed upon arrival or exhibitors will be provided a coupon from the show super-intendent that may be redeemed for first bedding material through the State Fair Feed Store on the fairgrounds on the day of arrival only. No outside bedding (including but not limited to bagged or baled wood shavings/chips, cedar fiber and small, square baled straw), will be permitted on the fairgrounds. Equivalents will be available for purchase from the State Fair Feed Store.
- 8. GROOMING/FITTING: Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Any product used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited, including, but not limited to, false hair, artificial color, adhesives, or other similar substances. The exhibitor is expected to care for, feed, fit and exhibit their animal/project while at the Fair. If needed, an exhibitor may have the assistance of the exhibitor's family, AST/CEA, local county/chapter adult volunteer, or another 4-H/FFA member. Any project cared for or fed by a custom fitter is not eligible. A custom fitter may be considered anyone who is not a family member, AST/CEA, local county/chapter adult volunteer, or another 4-H/FFA member. Violators of this rule are subject to disqualification, and may be denied the privilege to exhibit at the Fair in the future.

9. SHOW RING COMPETITION:

- a. ENTRY NUMBER: Entry number must be displayed/worn by exhibitors when exhibiting in the show ring.
- **b. ASSISTANCE:** Exhibitors may be assisted in the ring ONLY by other qualified youth exhibitors. Parents or other adults will not be allowed to assist youth exhibitors during judging of classes.

- 10. YOUTH LIVESTOCK AUCTION: The youth livestock exhibitor walking through the auction shall receive the price from the bidder brought at auction, but not to exceed the maximum price listed in this exhibitor handbook. If the price brought from the bidder at the auction exceeds the maximum listed, the remaining balance will be donated by the bidder to the Big Tex Scholarship Program fund. Non-walkers will receive premium monies, post Fair, based on the funds raised by the State Fair Auction committee, however, the maximum price is not guaranteed.
- **11. SCHOLARSHIPS:** Each youth livestock exhibitor shall be eligible to competitively apply for educational support upon completion and submission of an application to the Big Tex Scholarship Program.
- **12. USDA WHOLESOME MEAT ACT:** The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock and poultry which are sold during the Fair, which includes but is not limited to the following:
 - a. Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug, chemical or foreign substance residues;
 - b. Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed; and
 - c. If drug or chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned.

SHOW REQUIREMENTS

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and Youth Livestock Show Rules as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- 2. **ENTRY LIMITATION:** No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one market steer. All animals entered must be physically castrated males.
- 3. **OWNERSHIP:** All entries must be owned and continuously cared for by the exhibitor from June 30 through the show date of the Fair.
- **4. VALIDATION:** This show will adhere to the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- 5. CHECK-IN: Exhibitors must check-in with pre-distributed weight cards including state validation tag number, weight, and declared breed. Check-in must be completed by deadline on check-in day, or be subject to disqualification. Upon completion of check-in, exhibitors will receive two additional class cards. One class card will be required to show/consign animal; the second class card can be retained for exhibitor records. Once an exhibitor has officially checked-in and left the kiosk, the entry is final; no further changes can be made.
- **6. CLASSIFICATION**: Exhibitors will declare a primary and secondary breed choice at check-in. Declaration changes by the exhibitor will not be allowed at any time. Steers are subject to reclassification by a three-member committee. *See Classification Guidelines.
- 7. **EAR TAGS:** Steers must have a Texas State Validation ear tag. Only validation tags will be allowed. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.
 - a. **RE-TAG:** If an animal is missing the Texas State Validation ear tag upon arrival, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to take the animal to the designated location on check-in day for retag. Any ear tags damaged post check-in deadline must be reported to a State Fair or validation official WITH the damaged tag to purchase a replacement tag.
- 8. PROCESSING: Market steers must meet the following requirements or will be automatically sifted:
 - **a.** Be slick shorn to no more than 1/4" on any location of the body, including ears.
 - b. The tail switch will be no more than 12" above the end of the cartilage of the tail.
 - c. Be free of grubs or grub damage.
 - $\begin{tabular}{ll} \textbf{d.} & \textbf{Be dehorned and show no secondary horn growth in excess of one inch.} \end{tabular}$
 - **Decisions of official veterinarians, classifiers, and/or officials are final.
- **9. UNMANAGEABLE ANIMALS:** State Fair may disqualify any animal deemed unmanageable. Any animal escaping the control of it's exhibitor three times or more will be dismissed from the show ring.
- **10. GROOMING:** All animals must be slick shorn before arrival on the grounds. No clippers requiring an electrical outlet are permitted. This is a blow and go show. Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Grooming materials of any sort are not permitted.
- 11. TIE-OUTS: Tie-outs may be purchased at time of entry or from the Livestock Office (if available), on a first come, first serve basis post arrival deadline. Tie-outs will be assigned upon arrival. All cattle in tie-outs MUST wear a neck-tie.
- **12. SHOW WEIGHTS:** Exhibitors will turn in the official show weight for their steer at check-in. The minimum show weight for all market steers is 1,000 pounds. All steers weighing less than 1,000 pounds will be sifted.
- 13. WEIGH BACK: Any steer weighing more than 105% of the final declared weight will be disqualified. Steers weighing less than 95% than the official turn-in weight will be disqualified, documented, sold on re-weigh, and administered a \$20 penalty which will be deducted from their floor check, if consigned. The State Fair of Texas reserves the right to weigh back any animal.
 - a. CLASS: Placing steers will be reweighed at the discretion of SFT management.
 - b. CHAMPION DRIVE: Breed/division champion and reserve breed/division champions will re-weigh prior to com-

peting in the Grand Champion drive. If a breed/division champion, or reserve breed/division champion weighs out during the grand drive re-weigh, that entry is no longer eligible to compete. The exhibitor will not compete in the grand drive, as that specific breed/division will not be represented in the grand drive. The reserve breed/division champion, behind the champion that weighs out, will also not be eligible to compete for grand or reserve grand. However, the breed or reserve breed champion will still retain title as breed champion.

- **14. SHOW/SOLD BY RULE:** The following qualifying exhibitors for the Youth Livestock Auction (YLA) are required to be present on sale day with their animal to sell their project and receive proceeds.
 - a. BREED/DIVISION CHAMPION
 - b. RESERVE BREED/DIVISION CHAMPIONS
 - 1ST AND 2ND PLACE IN CLASS
 - ** Any required exhibitor, listed above, NOT present sale day will FORFEIT ALL SALE AND PREMIUM MONIES. The remaining exhibitors not listed do <u>not</u> attend the Auction. Premium monies will be mailed post Fair. All Youth Livestock Auction qualifying exhibitors and their animals are also subject to the YLA rules.
- **15. AUCTION ANIMAL RELOCATION:** All drug tested animals need to be relocated to the designated area 30 minutes after the completion of the show. All breed/division champions, reserve breed/division champions, first place and second place animals will enter the auction block and be provided a designated relocation Thursday night for hold-over until the sale. All other lower placing, non-drug tested animals that make the sale will be delivered directly to the consignment truck at the published time.
- **16. AUCTION ANIMAL POSSESSION/CARE:** All sale animals moved to the designated relocation area remain the responsibility of the youth exhibitor. At the conclusion of the auction, each exhibitor is responsible for ensuring their animal is delivered to the designated location by the designated time for shipping.
- 17. CLASSES, DIVISIONS, SALE LOTS: All animals will be weighed and divided into classes based on their classified breed and show weight.

STEER CLASSIFICATION GUIDELINES

version 2017-2021

BRITISH TYPE

This group includes cattle that appear to be purebred Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford, Red Angus, and Shorthorn.

Angus:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Angus
- Solid Black
- Polled
- Needs to have a tight sheath that is round and perpendicular to the ground
- Angus-type ear set, small to moderate ear size high on the head

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Continental breed type structure (being coarse about his joints, not to be confused with big-boned cattle) and head
- Bumps where horns would be on a horned animal
- Birthmarks or white hair in the switch should be reviewed for the skin color (black skin color is acceptable; white or pink skin is a disqualification)
- Non-Angus-type ear set (ear set and excessive ear size as in Continental breeds)
- · Large navels and angular sheaths

Absolute Disqualifications

- White skin resulting in white hair above the underline or in the front of the navel (White on the navel is acceptable)
- White skin resulting in white hair on the leg, foot or tail
- · Horns or scurs
- Brindle
- Diluter color pattern
- Dehorning scars
 - Double muscling

Hereford:

Ideal Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Hereford
- · Some white on the back of both ears
- Red body with white face, white underline, and whitemarked legs
- · Traditional feather on crest
- Horned Herefords must show evidence of being dehorned

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

These characteristics are not necessarily desirable and in combination may be discriminating.

- · Dark red color
- Red neck
- Solid red ear(s)
- Excess white on legs
- Excess white above the underline
- Eye pigment
- · Black hair in tail, or ear of animal
- Freckling on the nose
- White above switch in tail
- White across rump above the twist

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Solid white ear(s)
- Questionable ear size and shape
- Straight-line white markings on legs or tail above the switch
- White above the hocks, on the outside and back side of rear legs
- Excess pigment or color around the eyes
- · Red neck in combination with excess white on legs
- Line back
- Coarse joints, head, or ribs

- Solid black nose
- Diluter color pattern
- · Streaking of white from the feather off the shoulder

Polled Hereford:

Ideal Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Polled Hereford
- · Some white on the back of both ears
- Red body with white face, white underline, and whitemarked legs
- Traditional feather on crest
- Must be polled or have loose scurs

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Solid white ear(s)
- Questionable ear size and shape
- Straight-line white markings on legs or tail above the switch
- White above the hocks, on the outside and back side of rear legs
- · Excess pigment or color around the eyes
- Red neck in combination with excess white on legs
- Line back
- · Coarse joints, head, or ribs

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

These characteristics are not necessarily desirable and in combination may be discriminating

- · Dark red color
- Red neck
- Solid red ear(s)
- · Excess white on legs
- · Excess white above the underline
- Eye pigment
- · Black hair in tail, or ear of animal
- Freckling on the nose
- White above switch in tail
- · White across rump above the twist

Absolute Disqualifications

- Horn attachment to the skull
- · Evidence of tampering with horns, or dehorning scars
- Solid black nose
- Diluter color pattern
- Streaking of white from the feather off the shoulder

- Double muscling; extreme muscle definition
- Any color pattern other than red or white (birthmarks excluded)

Red Angus:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a Red Angus
- Solid red (shades may vary)
- Polled
- A blond, light red, or mixed switch
- Cattle may have black hair on the tail, muzzle, face, neck, and legs

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Coarse joints (not to be confused with big boned cattle)
- Solid White Switch

Absolute Disqualifications

- Horns or scurs breaking through the skin
- White skin resulting in white hair above the underline or in front of the navel (white on navel is acceptable)
- White skin resulting in white hair on the leg
- Black pigmentation of the skin. Not to be confused with freckling on the nose or anus
- Roaning
- Dehorning scars or evidence of dehorning
- Black Noses

Shorthorn:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Shorthorn
- Solid red; solid white with red hair or red pigment on ear, muzzle, anus or tail; or any combination of red and white, with the red and white color pattern bleeding together

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Motley face or brockle face
- Orange or light red color
- · Black nose pigment
- · Coarse head
- Coarse joints

- Diluter color pattern, such as yellow or yellow roan
- Blacks, blue roans, or grays
- Brindle
- Solid white with no red pigment on the ears, tail, or anus
- · Double muscling

BRAHMAN TYPE

This group is sometimes called American Breeds. Physical evidence of Brahman background is important (ear length and shape, amount of hide, hump/crest).

American Breeds Cross:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Any color or color pattern
- Progression of importance to include Bos indicus influenced head, eye, and ear (of moderate length, slightly pointed, drooping and opening down and forward); showing Bos indicus influenced sheath
- · Crest or evidence of hump
- With adequate Bos indicus head, eye, and ear characteristics; sheath score is of less importance

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Bos taurus head
- Bos taurus short ear
- Bos taurus eye
- Sheath score of 1
- Slick neck (lack of crest or evidence of hump)

Absolute Disqualifications

A combination of a Bos taurus head, eye, and ear

Brahman:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a half-blood Brahman
- A prominent hump beginning at the shoulder and going forward but must angle back down to the neck to create a hump – not a crest
- Any color or color pattern
- With adequate Bos indicus head, eye, and ear characteristics; sheath score is of less importance

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

Sheath score of 1

Absolute Disqualifications

- A crest with an inadequate hump
- Lack of hump or presence of hump
- A combination of a Bos taurus head, eye, and ear

Brangus:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred black Brangus
- Solid black with no white above the underline or in front of the navel
- Polled
- Progression of importance to include Bos indicus influenced head, eye, and ear (of moderate length, slightly pointed, drooping and opening down and forward);
- With adequate Bos indicus head, eye, and ear characteristics; sheath score is of less importance
- · Shows some evidence of a crest

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Scurs or slick spots
- Excessive, pendulous sheath
- Inadequate Bos indicus-influence head, eye, and ear characteristics
- Brown dilution over ribs, fore flank,
 twist and muzzle
- Sheath score of 1

- Horns
- · Dehorning scars
- White above the underline or in front of the navel
- White on the legs, feet, or tail
- Any brindle

Santa Gertrudis:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a half-blood Santa Gertrudis with adequate Bos indicus head, eye, and ear characteristics.
- Any color pattern of black, red, yellow or orange
- Moderate crest, no definite hump
- Moderate dewlap development
- Moderate length of ear, slightly drooping and opening forward
- Sheath score of 2-5

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Straight, pendulous sheath
- Slight brindle color
- · Sheath score of 1

Absolute Disqualifications

- Absence of any visible Santa Gertrudis characteristics
- Absence of Bos indicus-influence head, eye, ear, or sheath
- Smoke, silvers, grays or tiger-stripes

Simbrah:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a purebred Simbrah
 (3/8 Brahman and 5/8 Simmental)
- A sheath score of 2 or greater
- With Bos indicus head, eye, and ear characteristics; sheath score is of less importance
- Stocking legs
- Bald, blaze, or streak face or mottled face
- Solid black, solid red or solid dun/ tan/yellow combination with white or any of the previously listed colors
- Brindle color pattern preferably with white markings

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- A sheath score of 1
- A Bos taurus head
- A Bos taurus ear
- · A Bos taurus eye
- Solid yellow

Absolute Disqualifications

- A combination of a Bos taurus head, ear, eye, and sheath
- Roans
- Grays
- Silver
- Smut
- Diluter color pattern

CONTINENTAL or EXOTIC TYPE

Included here are Charolais (half-blood and higher), Limousin, Maine-Anjou (half or higher), and Simmental (purebred).

Charolais:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a half-blood purebred Charolais
- White, yellow gray, or silver (moderate dappling allowed)
- · Expression of diluter gene
- Minimal painting or spotting less than 20%
- Skunk tail, line back, baldy

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Excessive painting or spotting (over 20%)
- Double muscling
- Brindles
- Frail bone work and frail general appearance
- Light red color or orange
- · Short, stubby head
- · Overly refined, narrow head
- Excessive dark pigmentation (eyes, nose, ears, and anus)
- Excessive dappling

- Black, red, dark smuts
- Showing no diluter gene, unless solid white
- Excessive painting or spotting

Limousin:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must physically exhibit breed characteristics of a Limousin
- Solid black, red/orange, light red, charcoal black, chocolate black, orange or brockle-face
- Brindle color pattern will be allowed providing it does not extend below the mid-rib of the body
- Bald face
- Tend to be smooth shouldered
- Head
 - Eye Deeper socket, prominent brow, light pigment around eye on reds
 - Poll -Needs to have a wide poll
 - Ear Tends to be smaller and rounder
 - Muzzle Tends to be short
- Sheath Tends to have a forward angle
- Legs/feet
 - Tend to be smooth jointed
 - Tend to be flat boned

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Coarse joints, skeleton, and head
- Course open shoulders
- Pencil sheath, hanging straight down
- Pointed poll
- Excessive crest
- White Switch

Absolute Disqualifications

- Stocking legs

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Solid red
- Solid black

- Heavy skeletal structure

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

None

Absolute Disqualifications

- Brindle
- Roan
- Diluter color pattern
- Appears to be more than 50% of any other breed

Simmental:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Appear to physically exhibit characteristics of a purebred Simmen-
- Solid black, red, red and white, yellow and white, black and white
- Some painting or spotting above the underline
- Bald, blaze, or streak face
- Typically longer head, larger ears

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Motley/Brockle face
- Excessive white above the underline

- Brindle
- Roans
- Smut or gray, white, smoky, silver or any combination of these
- Skunk tail

CROSS DIVISIONS

Black Cross Division:

- Must have a black body cavity. Defined as the area behind the top of the shoulder blade down to the point of the shoulder and above the belly line.
- White in the body cavity is only acceptable in the following instances:
 - » White is a continuation of the feathering.
 - » White is at the fore and/or rear flanks similar to Hereford color pattern.
 - » White spotting not collectively larger than 9in(basketball size) in diameter per side (cannot be all on the same side)
- Skunk tail cattle are permitted provided the white above the rectum does not exceed the amount of white spotting allowed (basketball size).
- Absent of diluter gene.
- Brindle color pattern will be allowed providing it does not extend below the mid-rib of the body.
- No roan cattle permitted.

Red Cross Division:

- Must have a red body cavity. Defined as the area behind the top of the shoulder blade down to the point of the shoulder and above the belly line.
- White in the body cavity is only acceptable in the following instances:
 - » White is a continuation of the feathering.
 - » White is at the fore and/or rear flanks similar to Hereford color pattern.
 - » White spotting not collectively larger than 9in(basketball size) in diameter per side (cannot be all on the same side)
- Skunk tail cattle are permitted provided the white above the rectum does not exceed the amount of white spotting allowed (basketball size).
- · Absent of diluter gene.
- Brindle color pattern will be allowed providing it does not extend below the mid-rib of the body.
- · No roan cattle permitted.

Other Cross Division:

Steers of any coloration pattern are acceptable.

Classification Glossary:

- American breeds: Breeds created in the US by interbreeding existing breeds, including at least one tropically adapted breed (most often American Brahman).
- Bald face: Appearance when white covers most of the face.
- Blaze or streak face: A wide strip of white down the face to the muzzle.
- Bos indicus (zebu): Subspecies of cattle originating in south Asia; has a prominent hump on top or in front of shoulder.
- Bos taurus: Subspecies of cattle; originated in west Asia but is usually called European.
- Brindle: A streaking of black, brown, or white on the body of the steer (tiger stripe).
- British/English: Cattle originating in the British Isles; Angus, Hereford, and Shorthorn are most numerous in the US.
- Brockle or motley face: Red or black spotting on a white or bald face.
- Continental: Breeds originating in Continental Europe; sometimes called European or Exotic.
- Diluter gene: A gene that determines color. Cattle that carry both copies of the gene will appear white. Non-diluter
 cattle will appear black or dark red, whereas those carrying a single diluter gene will appear gray or yellow.
- Discriminatory Breed Characteristics: Characteristics that are not reason for absolute disqualification but in combination with other discriminatory visual characteristics could lead to disqualification.
- Horned: Horns are solidly attached to the skull, or there is evidence of dehorning.
- Painting: Large white markings covering a major portion of the steer.
- Pigmentation: Dark skin coloring on the points of the steer (eyes, nose, ears, anus, tail).
- Polled: Naturally hornless.
- Purebred: Showing visual characteristics of a particular breed and none of any other breed.
- · Scurs: Horny tissue or rudimentary horn attached to skin but not the skull.
- Sheath score: Scoring system from 1 to 5 based on the length of the sheath (1 = little sheath; 5 = excess sheath).
- · Smut: Dark gray color pattern.
- · Spotting: White spots on the steer.

Summary:

Steers should be selected and shown based only on their visual appearance as that is how they will be evaluated for classification. Classifiers are asked to exercise their judgment. If your steer is classified out, it doesn't mean that the classifier or anyone else is accusing you of lying, cheating, or being unethical. Nor does it mean that the steer cannot be the breed you say it is. Look at breed classification as the first stage of judging. Don't be too upset if the classifier makes (or you think he or she has made) a mistake. It's all a matter of judgment.

SHOW REQUIREMENTS

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and Youth Livestock Show Rules as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- 2. **ENTRY LIMITATION:** No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one market barrow. All animals entered must be physically castrated males.
- 3. **OWNERSHIP:** All entries must be owned and continuously cared for by the exhibitor from June 30 through the show date of the Fair.
- **4. VALIDATION:** This show will adhere to the recommendations of the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- 5. **TERMINAL SHOW:** All barrows arriving will be sold, including sifted, non-placing and placing barrows. All exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animal from arrival until the animal is delivered to the truck for consignment. All barrows must be delivered to the consignment truck no later than 30 minutes after the completion of the last class, each show day.
- **6. CHECK-IN:** Exhibitors must check-in with pre-distributed weight cards including state validation tag number, weight, and declared breed. Check-in must be completed by deadline on check-in day, or be subject to disqualification. Upon completion of check-in, exhibitors will receive a two additional class cards. One class card will be required to show/ consign animal; the second class card can be retained for exhibitor records or as a receipt. Once an exhibitor has officially checked-in and left the kiosk, the entry is final; no further changes can be made.
- 7. **STALLING:** Barrows may be stalled with other counties/chapters in each wave. There will be approximately 2-4 headper pen; BRING dividers, they will not be provided for you.
- **8. EAR TAGS:** Barrows must have a Texas State Validation ear tag. Only validation tags will be allowed. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.
 - **a. RE-TAG:** If an animal is missing the Texas State Validation ear tag upon arrival, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to take the animal to the designated location on check-in day for retag. Any ear tags damaged post check-in deadline must be reported to a State Fair or validation official WITH the damaged tag to purchase a replacement tag.
- **9. GROOMING:** All animals must be clipped prior to arrival on the grounds. No clippers requiring an electrical outlet are permitted. Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Grooming materials leaving any color or other residue are not permitted. WATER ONLY!
- **10. CLASSIFICATION:** Exhibitors will declare a breed at check in. Declaration changes by the exhibitor will not be allowed at any time. Barrows will be classified at the time of judging by a three person committee.
 - **a.** If a Dark OPB, Duroc, or Hampshire class out of their breed in wave 1, they are eligible to holdover and exhibit only as a Dark Cross in wave 2 or may chose to be sifted/consigned.
 - **b.** If a Berkshire classes out, they will be required to re-class to compete as a Dark Cross.
 - **c.** If a Dark Cross or Light OPB classes out, they are eligible to hold over and exhibit only as an Other Cross in wave 3 or may chose to be sifted/consigned.
 - d. *Classed out barrows will not be permitted to hold over for more than one wave under any circumstances.
 - e. *See Classification Guidelines for breed/division characteristics.
- 11. SHOW WEIGHTS: Exhibitors will turn in the official show weight for their barrow at check-in. The minimum show

- weight is 250 pounds and not to exceed 300 pounds.
- 12. WEIGH BACK: Any barrow weighing more than 10 pounds above the final declared weight will be disqualified. Barrows weighing 10 pounds lighter than the official turn-in weight will be disqualified, sold on re-weigh, and administered a \$20 penalty which will be deducted from their floor check. The State Fair of Texas reserves the right to weigh back any animal.
 - a. CLASS: Placing barrows will be re-weighed at the discretion of SFT management.
 - b. CHAMPION DRIVE: Breed/division champion and reserve breed/division champions will re-weigh prior to competing in the Grand Champion drive. If a breed/division champion, or reserve breed/division champion weighs out during the grand drive re-weigh, that entry is no longer eligible to compete. The exhibitor will not compete in the grand drive, as that specific breed/division will not be represented in the grand drive. The reserve breed/division champion, behind the champion that weighs out, will also not be eligible to compete for grand or reserve grand. However, the breed or reserve breed champion will still retain title as breed champion.
 - i. WAVE 1: Any barrow weighing more than 20 pounds above/below the final declared weight will be disqualified.
 - ii. WAVE 2: Any barrow weighing more than 15 pounds above/below the final declared weight will be disqualified.
 - iii. WAVE 3: Any barrow weighing more than 10 pounds above/below the final declared weight will be disqualified.
- **13. SHOW/SOLD BY RULE:** The following qualifying exhibitors for the Youth Livestock Auction (YLA) are required to be present on sale day with their animal to sell their project and receive proceeds:
 - a. BREED/DIVISION CHAMPIONS
 - b. RESERVE BREED/DIVISION CHAMPIONS
 - **c.** 1ST PLACE (with barrow)
 - d. 2nd PLACE (no barrow required)
 - ** Any required exhibitor, listed above, NOT present sale day will FORFEIT ALL SALE AND PREMIUM MONIES. The remaining exhibitors not listed do <u>not</u> attend the Auction, however, premium checks will be mailed post Fair. All Youth Livestock Auction qualifying exhibitors and their animals are also subject to the YLA rules.
- 14. AUCTION ANIMAL RELOCATION: All drug tested animals need to be relocated to the designated area 30 minutes after the completion of the show. All breed/division, reserve breed/division champions, and class winners from wave 1 will relocate to designated aisle directed by the superintendents following the completion of the last breed drive for holdover. All breed/division champions, reserve breed/division champions, and first place animals will enter the auction block and be provided a designated relocation following the completion of the grand drive. All other lower placing, non-drug tested animals that make the sale will be delivered directly to the consignment truck at published time.
- 15. AUCTION ANIMAL POSSESSION/CARE: All sale animals moved to the designated relocation area remain the responsibility of the youth exhibitor. At the conclusion of the auction, each exhibitor is responsible for ensuring their animal is delivered to the designated location by the designated time for shipping.
- 16. BREEDS, CLASSES, SALE LOTS: All animals will be weighed and divided into classes based on their classified breed and show weight.

BARROW CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

updated July 2019


A collaboration by the Texas County Agricultural Agents Association, Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association of Texas, Animal Industries Committee, Texas FFA, Texas 4-H and Texas Pork Producers Association.

All animals must be properly ear notched within seven (7) days of birth with a litter notch in the right ear and individual notch in the left ear to be eligible for the Texas 4-H and FFA Swine Validation Program. Animals not properly notched in both ears will be disqualified. Registration papers, breeder affidavits, or other paperwork is not considered in the classification process. Eligibility for the class is determined only by visual appraisal, as evaluated by classifiers appointed by show management.

BERKSHIRE


Ideal Characteristics

- Predominantly black with erect ears, possessing Berkshire breed character with regards to skull shape and ear shape.
- Six white points: nose, each leg/foot and at end of tail (unless tail is docked).




Discriminatory Characteristics

- Gray pigmentation on body (spotting/mottling pattern).
- Moderate amount of white skin splashes.




Acceptable Characteristics

- Occasional splash of white skin/hair may appear on the body.
- Three of the four legs/feet must be white.
- Ear can have white on it (not full coverage).
- Red or fawn hair, if over black or white skin pigmentation.
- Ear deformity/ear folded in a backwards position towards hog's body/crinkled ear.



- Solid white or black face from base of ear forward.
- · Solid black nose (white does not break rim).
- Solid white ear.
- Excessive white on body.
- Full coverage of white coming up the lower 1/3 of the body (not counting legs) that extends from the base of the jaw thru sternum and lower body through seam of the ham.
- White splash extends from rear leg to upper hip.
- White skin/hair that continuously encircles the body anywhere between the base of the ear and the base of the tail.
- · Any evidence of belt formation.
- Lacks breed character (skull and/or ear shape).
- Any evidence of physical tampering.



DUROC:


Ideal Characteristics

- Must be red in color, possessing Duroc breed character.
- Ears are down when hog is in a relaxed position.



Discriminatory Characteristics

- Minimal amounts of black hair.
- Black spots on the skin under two inches in diameter.
- · Partially erect/level ears (flighty).



Acceptable Characteristics

- Acceptable colors range from light red to dark brown.
- Ear deformity/ear folded in a backwards position towards hog's body/crinkled ear.


- Excessive amounts of black hair.
- White hair.
- White skin on the body or legs, or that extends over the rim of the nose.
- Four (4) or more black spots on the skin, any of which are larger than two (2) inches in diameter.
- Evidence of a belt.
- · Erect ears.
- Any evidence of physical tampering that would alter breed character.



HAMPSHIRE:

Ideal Characteristics

- Black in color with a full white belt over the shoulders encompassing both front legs/feet.
- Erect ears.
- Possess Hampshire breed character with regards to skull shape and ear shape.





- Belt is in front or behind of a solid black front leg.
- If belt v's and runs towards the poll (base of the ear).



- Black head with a white body, with evidence of pigment and freckling down the top.
- White belt starting on a front foot/leg; belt partially encircles body extending to at least the chest floor (half belt).

- Streaking or evidence of white on forehead.

DARK ALL OTHER PUREBREDS (DOPB): POLAND CHINA:

Ideal Characteristics

- Predominantly black possessing Poland China breed character.
- Six white points: nose, each leg/foot and at the end of the tail (unless tail is docked).
- Ears are down when hog is in a relaxed position.




A slight continuation of white from the legs to the body.

- Ear can have white on it.
- Three of the four legs must be white.
- May have an occasional splash of white on the body.

Acceptable Characteristics

- Hair and skin texture can vary from coarse to thin, and color can vary from dark black to ashy/pale.
- Ear deformity/ear folded in a backwards position towards hog's body/crinkled ear.










- Predominantly black with white spots or predominantly white with black spots.

Absolute Disqualifications

- Erect ears.
- · Solid black head from base of ears forward.
- Distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.
- Red hair.
- Excessive brown spots.
- Any evidence of physical tampering that would alter breed character.



DARK CROSSBRED:

- Barrows with black and/or red pigmentation (NOT blue, gray, sandy, rusty, orange or roan) comprising at least 20% of the total body area, shall be considered Dark Cross.
- Barrows may be black or red belted, black/red patched or spotted.
- Barrows with only blue, gray, sandy, rusty and orange pigmentation are NOT considered Dark Crosses. Barrows that do not meet the classification requirements for Dark Crossbred will NOT be re-classed.

YORKSHIRE:

Ideal Characteristics

Must be completely white in color with erect ears, possessing Yorkshire breed character.

Discriminatory Characteristics

- Excessively large or wavy ears.
- Color pigmentation (on body):
 - Two individual pigmentation spots of which neither can be larger than a U.S. minted dime.
 - One pigmentation spot cannot be larger than a U.S. minted quarter.

Acceptable Characteristics

Ear deformity/ear folded in a backwards position towards hog's body/crinkled ear.

- Any hair color that is NOT white.
- Broken/down ears.
- Combined pigmentation spots that exceed a U.S. minted silver dollar.
- · Any series of dots that indicate masking.
- Any evidence of physical tampering that would alter breed character.

LIGHT ALL OTHER PUREBREDS (LOPB): CHESTER WHITE:

Ideal Characteristics

- Solid white in color possessing Chester White breed character.
- Medium sized ears are down when hog is in a relaxed position.



Discriminatory Characteristics

- Partially erect/level ear (flighty).

- · Erect ears.

LANDRACE:

Ideal Characteristics

- Must be solid white and possess Landrace breed character.
- Ears droop and slant forward coming to a sharper point.

 Ear deformity/ear folded in a backwards position towards hog's body/crinkled ear.



Discriminatory Characteristics

- Short rounded ears.
- · Short snout mimicking that of a Chester White.

- · Erect ears.
- Any hair color other than white.
- More than 3 spots of skin pigmentation; each individual spot cannot be larger than a U.S. minted quarter.
- Any evidence of physical tampering that would alter breed character.

- **4. VALIDATION:** This show will adhere to the recommendations of the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- 5. TLBA: The Texas Lamb Breeders Association will award premium money to top placing Texas-bred lambs. An official TLBA tag must be present during the show and the TLBA tag number must be recorded on the official validation form.
- 6. CHECK-IN: Exhibitors must check-in with pre-distributed weight cards including state validation tag number, weight, and declared breed. Check-in must be completed by deadline on check-in day, or be subject to disqualification. Upon completion of check-in, exhibitors will receive a two additional class cards. One class card will be required to show/ consign animal; the second class card can be retained for exhibitor records or as a receipt. Once an exhibitor has officially checked-in and left the kiosk, the entry is final; no further changes can be made.
- 7. STALLING: Lambs and goats will be stalled together upon arrival. BRING dividers, they will not be provided to you.
- 8. EAR TAGS: Sheep must have a Texas State Validation ear tag. Scrapie and TLBA tags are allowed but not necessary. Scrapie tags with breeder identification will be covered with tape so not readable. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.
 - a. RE-TAG: If an animal is missing the Texas State Validation ear tag upon arrival, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to take the animal to the designated location on check-in day for retag. Any ear tags damaged post check-in deadline must be reported to a State Fair or validation official WITH the damaged tag to purchase a replacement tag.
 - b. Lost TLBA may also be replaced on check-in day.
- 9. GROOMING: All animals must be shorn before arrival on the grounds. Sheep must be slick shorn to the skin from knee and hock up including long wool around the ears. No clippers requiring an electrical outlet are permitted. Grooming tables are not allowed. Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Grooming materials leaving any kind of residue are not permitted. Sheep must be free of external parasites and fungus. **Decisions of official veterinarians and/or officials is final.
- **10. CLASSIFICATION:** Exhibitors will declare a breed at check-in. Breed changes by the exhibitor will not be allowed at any time. Sheep are subject to reclassification by a three person committee.
 - **a.** Any Dorper, Finewool Cross or Southdown not meeting breed standards will be placed in the Medium Wool Division.*See Classification Guidelines.
- **11. SHOW WEIGHTS:** Exhibitors will turn in the official show weight for their sheep at check-in. The minimum show weight is 100 pounds (90 pounds for Southdown and Dorper).
- **12. WEIGH BACK:** Any sheep weighing more than 5 pounds of the final declared weight will be disqualified. Sheep weighing less than 5 pounds than the official turn-in weight will be disqualified, sold on re-weigh, and administered a \$20 penalty which will be deducted from their floor check, if consigned. The State Fair of Texas reserves the right to weigh back any animal.
 - a. CLASS: Placing sheep will be re-weighed at the discretion of SFT management.
 - b. CHAMPION DRIVE: Breed/division champion and reserve breed/division champions will re-weigh prior to competing in the Grand Champion drive. If a breed/division champion, or reserve breed/division champion weighs out during the grand drive re-weigh, that entry is no longer eligible to compete. The exhibitor will not compete in the grand drive, as that specific breed/division will not be represented in the grand drive. The reserve breed/division champion, behind the champion that weighs out, will also not be eligible to compete for grand or reserve grand.

However, the breed or reserve breed champion will still retain title as breed champion.

- 13. SHOW/SOLD BY RULE: The following qualifying exhibitors for the Youth Livestock Auction (YLA) are required to be present on sale day with their animal to sell their project and receive proceeds:
 - a. BREED/DIVISION CHAMPIONS
 - b. RESERVE BREED/DIVISION CHAMPIONS
 - c. 1ST PLACE (with sheep)
 - **d.** 2nd PLACE (no sheep required)
 - ** Any required exhibitor, listed above, NOT present sale day will FORFEIT ALL SALE AND PREMIUM MONIES. The remaining exhibitors not listed do not attend the Youth Livestock Auction however, premium checks will be mailed post Fair.
 - All Youth Livestock Auction qualifying exhibitors and their animals are also subject to the YLA rules.
- **14. AUCTION ANIMAL RELOCATION:** All drug tested animals need to be relocated to the designated area 30 minutes after the completion of the show. All breed/division champions, reserve breed/division champions, and first place animals that will enter the auction block will be provided a designated relocation following the completion of the grand drive. All other lower placing, non-drug tested animals that make the sale will be delivered directly to the consignment truck at published time.
- **15. AUCTION ANIMAL POSSESSION/CARE:** All sale animals moved to the designated relocation area following the completion of the grand drive will be under care of the State Fair of Texas. On auction day, youth exhibitors will reclaim their animal to participate in the auction. At the conclusion of the auction, each exhibitor is responsible to deliver their animal to the designated location for consignment.
- **16. BREEDS, CLASSES, SALE LOTS:** All animals will be weighed and divided into classes based on their classified breed and show weight.

LAMB CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS

updated January 2020

DORPER:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must be a Dorper or White Dorper.
- Conformation long, deep, wide body with well sprung ribs and excellent muscling.
- Color: Dorper white sheep with black limited to head, neck and forequarters not extending below the knee to the dewclaw or behind the heart girth. White Dorper white sheep.
- Must have at least 1/3 hair primarily on belly, forearm, and britch.
- 100% hair below the knees and hocks.
- 100% hair forward of poll.
- Moderate size ear with no wool covering.
- Head should be strong, bold, with a deep jaw.
- Polled or small horns or scurs.
- Spots or speckles in the skin only when shorn.
- Dorper black spots above the hoof line and below the dewclaw.

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Tall, leggy, shallow bodied, narrow, light muscled lambs.
- A limited amount of spots on body and underline not to exceed a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- A white sheep with brown or red colored speckles in the covering confined to the head and neck.
- Excessive wool covering more than 2/3 of body (belly, forearm, and britch).
- Wool forward of poll.
- · Heavy horns.
- · Long, pendulous ears.
- Long, narrow muzzle.

Absolute Disqualifications

- All wool or very little evidence of hair on belly, forearm, or britch.
- Wool below the knees or hocks.
- Wool on the ears.
- Excessive amount of dark fibered spots on body an underline behind girl exceeding a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Solid brown, red, rust colored head.
- Speckling or spots from knee to dewclaw or from hock to dewclaw.
- Strong breed characteristics of breeds other than Dorper or White Dorper.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.
- Evidence of color alterations.

FINEWOOL:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Rambouillet, Delaine, Debouillet, or a cross between these breeds.
- · Silky, white face.
- Silky ears, medium to moderate in length.
- · Soft pelt.
- Yellow to white hooves (neutral).
- Black pads on hooves and black dew claws.
- Minimal amount of black streaking in the hooves. Less than 1/8 of cumlative hoof surface.
- Nose should be neutral to pink in color.
- May be polled or horned. Horns must be indicative of acceptable Finewool breeds.

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Moderate amounts of brown or black spots in the skin and/or wool.
- Moderate freckling or pigmented skin (brown or black) on the ears, eyes, nose, and lips.
- · Black eyelashes.
- Excessive black streaking in hooves more than 1/8 cumulative of hoof surface.
- · Birthmarks.

- Excessively coarse britch and/or harsh pelt.
- Excessive coarse, chalky, white hair on the face, in the flanks, and/ or down the front and/or rear legs.
- Excessive brown or black spots in the skin and/or wool.
- Excessive freckling or pigmented skin (brown or black) on the ears, eyes, nose, and lips.
- Brown or black spots in hairline above the hooves to the dew claw.
- Solid black hooves.
- Black lambs.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.
- Head shape non-typical to the Finewool breeds (Rambouillet, Delaine, Debouillet, or a cross between these breeds).

FINEWOOL CROSS:

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Must be a cross with evidence of at least 50% finewool breeding and the remaining percentage exhibiting predominance of ONLY Hampshire and/or Suffolk breeding.
- Soft pelt which is characteristic of ½ blood wool (60's-62's spinning count).
- Face and ears should be soft and silky.
- Spotting and/or brown face and ears.
- Moderate spotting and/or brown legs not extending above the rear flank and fore flank.
- Wool must be present below the hocks on the rear legs; wool below the knees on the front legs is not necessary.
- Reddish, rust colored legs are acceptable.
- White-faced or ring-eyed crosses are acceptable if pelt is acceptable - as long as no discriminatory characteristics are present.
- Birthmarks.
- Scurs and/horns are acceptable.
 Horns must be indicative of acceptable Finewool breeds.

Acceptable Breed Characteristics

- Hair color on muzzle should be mouse colored, gray to brown and match color on legs and pasterns.
- Nostril pigmentation may be black to purplish-gray.
- Head and muzzle should be broad and proportional to body.
- Head of moderate length and in proportion to body.
- Ears of moderate length, in proportion to body, and covered with short hair or wool.
- · Black hooves.
- · Slight chalk around eyes.
- Slight chalk around muzzle.
- Spots or speckles in the skin only when shorn.

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Excessive black spotting in the skin above the knees and hocks.
- Moderate black or brown color on face, ears and legs (including wool.)
- Moderately coarse britch and/or harsh pelt.
- Moderately coarse, chalky, white hair on face, in the flanks, and/or down the front and/or rear legs.

Absolute Disqualifications

- Excessive black or dark chocolate brown color on face, ears, and legs (including wool).
- Excessively coarse britch and/or harsh pelt.
- Excessive coarse, chalky, white hair on the face, in the flanks, and/ or down the front and/or rear legs.
- Total absence of wool on rear legs.
- Black lambs.
- Evidence of other breeds including but not limited to Dorset and Southdown breed types (head and ear shape of Dorset and/or Southdown)
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.

SOUTHDOWN:

Discriminatory Breed Characteristics

- Solid white color or dark chocolate color on muzzle.
- Coarse britch and/or harsh pelt.
- Predominately pink nose with few black spots.
- Long, narrow muzzle.
- Excessive black pigmentation on ears.
- Excessive ear length not in proportion to head.
- No hair or wool on ears.
- Scurs.
- Absence of wool between scur areas.
- Striped hooves.
- Reddish, rust colored hair above hoof to pastern.
- Black fiber in wool outside of birthmark.
- Birthmarks.

Absolute Disqualifications

- Speckled face, ears, or legs.
- Horns.
- White hooves.
- Intentional alteration of hair color or skin pigmentation.
- Total pink pigmentation of nostrils.
- Black lambs.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.

MEDIUM WOOL:

This class generally includes the Suffolk and Hampshire breeds, plus all lambs that do not fit into the Dorper, Finewool, Finewool Cross, and Southdown breed classes.

SHOW REQUIREMENTS

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and Youth Livestock Show Rules as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- **2. ENTRY LIMITATION:** No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one market goat. All animals entered must be physically castrated males.
- 3. **OWNERSHIP:** All entries must be owned and continuously cared for by the exhibitor from June 30 through the show date of the Fair.
- **4. VALIDATION:** This show will adhere to the recommendations of the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- **5. TGBA:** The Texas Goat Breeders Association will award premium money to top placing Texas-bred goats. An official TGBA tag must be present during the show and the TGBA tag number must be recorded on the official validation form
- **6. CHECK-IN:** Exhibitors must check-in with pre-distributed weight cards including state validation tag number and show weight. Check-in must be completed by deadline on check-in day, or be subject to disqualification. Upon completion of check-in, exhibitors will receive a two additional class cards. One class card will be required to show/consign animal; the second class card can be retained for exhibitor records or as a receipt. Once an exhibitor has officially checked-in and left the kiosk, the entry is final; no further changes can be made.
- 7. STALLING: Goats and lambs will be stalled together upon arrival. BRING dividers, they will not be provided to you.
- **8. EAR TAGS:** Goats must have a Texas State Validation ear tag. Scrapie and TGBA tags are allowed but not necessary. Scrapie tags with breeder identification will be covered with tape so not readable. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.
 - **a. RE-TAG:** If an animal is missing the Texas State Validation ear tag upon arrival, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to take the animal to the designated location on check-in day for retag. Any ear tags damaged post check-in deadline must be reported to a State Fair or validation official WITH the damaged tag to purchase a replacement tag.
 - b. Lost TGBA tags may also be replaced.
- 9. GROOMING: All animals must be shorn before arrival on the grounds. Slick shorn to the skin from knee and hock up, excluding tip of tail. Must have horns tipped, no sharp points allowed, dime size or larger. No clippers requiring an electrical outlet are permitted. Grooming tables are not allowed. Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Grooming materials of any kind are not permitted. Animals must be free of external parasites or fungus.
 **Decisions of official veterinarians and/or officials is final.
- **10. SHOW WEIGHTS:** Exhibitors will turn in the official show weight for their goat at check-in. Goats must meet the minimum weight of 50 pounds and shall not exceed 120 pounds.
- 11. WEIGH BACK: Any goat weighing more than 5 pounds of the final declared weight will be disqualified. Goats weighing less than 5 pounds than the official turn-in weight will be disqualified, sold on re-weigh, and administered a \$20 penalty which will be deducted from their floor check, if consigned. The State Fair of Texas reserves the right to weigh back any animal.
 - a. CLASS: Placing goats will be re-weighed at the discretion of SFT management.
 - b. CHAMPION DRIVE: Breed/division champion and reserve breed/division champions will re-weigh prior to competing in the Grand Champion drive. If a breed/division champion, or reserve breed/division champion weighs out during the grand drive re-weigh, that entry is no longer eligible to compete. SHOW REQUIREMENTS

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and Youth Livestock Show Rules as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- 2. ENTRY LIMITATION: No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than two pens of three broilers each. All broilers must be ordered from Texas A&M AgriLife Poultry Science Extension Unit. If both pens place high enough to make the sale, only the highest placing will sale.
- 3. BROILER CHICK ORDERS: Broiler chicks must be ordered through Texas A&M AgriLife Poultry Science Extension Unit before June 30. See the Texas A&M University Poultry Science website. Exhibitors may only order 25, 50, or 75 chicks per exhibitor or family, and may only exhibit birds from their individual or family set of wing band numbers. Broiler pick up is located at the Poultry Science Center on the Texas A&M University Campus, College Station ("TAMU"). All birds must be picked up on designated date published by the Texas A&M AgriLife Poultry Science Extension Unit. Chicks will be straight run.
- **4. HATCH DATE:** Broilers will be approximately 6 weeks of age at show date. <u>See bigtex.com/livestock</u> for official date.
- 5. WINGBANDS: All chicks will be wing banded. The person picking up the chick order at TAMU is responsible for checking and confirming wing bands at the time of pickup. No broiler will be accepted at the State Fair without the original wing band properly in place. Exhibitors are requested to consult with their CEA/AST in the proper management methods of rearing wing banded birds.
- **6. OWNERSHIP:** All entries must be owned and continuously cared for by the exhibitor from hatch date through the show date of the Fair.
- 7. **ALTERNATE BIRDS**: Exhibitors are only allowed to alternate birds that have been banded and validated in the name of the exhibitor. Exhibitors are not allowed to alternate birds after going through the sift.
- 8. **INELIGIBLE BIRDS:** If the bird expires between check-in/preliminary scoring and call back of its respective quality group, the pen will be ineligible to compete. If the bird expires in the arena during final evaluation, placing within its respective quality group will be left to the discretion of the judge.
- 9. FEED: Each exhibitor is required to provide their own feed and fresh water until birds are sifted/shown.
- **10. LITTER:** Litter will be furnished by the show.
- 11. UNLOADING: Upon arrival, all broilers are required to enter through Gate 15 for inspection at Animal Health.
- 12. SHOW LOCATION: Sifting and showing broilers will be held in the Livestock Judging Pavilion.
- **13. SIFTING:** Pens of broilers will be sifted and scored upon arrival. All entries must be of U.S. Grade A live market quality to be accepted. A pen may be sifted for the lack of uniformity. Any broiler which has no wing band, regardless of reason, will be sifted. Sick or diseased broilers will be refused entry and if discovered during the show, will be removed. Any broiler with reduced comb growth or other secondary sex characteristics, which indicate the presence of a hormone, will be sifted. Sifted birds will be marked at time of sifting. The fair assumes no responsibility for birds or coops.
- 14. JUDGING PROCEDURES: Birds will be split-shown by sex. Each pen must be the same sex throughout.
- **15. PLACING:** Once a Grand Champion pen is selected, if that given exhibitor has an additional pen in contention for Reserve Grand Champion, that pen becomes ineligible.
- 16. TERMINAL SHOW: This is a terminal show for all broilers that arrive, show/sift.
- 17. SHOW/SOLD BY RULE: The following qualifying exhibitors for the Youth Livestock Auction of Champions (YLA) are required to be present on sale day to sell their project and receive proceeds: Top 5 lots of each sex (with broiler)
 - ** Any required exhibitor, listed above, NOT present sale day will FORFEIT ALL SALE AND PREMIUM MONIES. The remaining exhibitors not listed do <u>not</u> attend the Auction. Premium monies will be mailed post Fair. All Youth Livestock Auction qualifying exhibitors and their animals are also subject to the YLA rules.
- 18. AUCTION ANIMAL POSSESSION/CARE: All sale animals moved to the designated relocation area following the completion of the grand drive will be under care of the State Fair of Texas. On auction day, youth exhibitors will re-

claim their animal to participate in the auction. At the conclusion of the auction, each exhibitor is responsible to deliver their animal to the designated location for consignment.

19. SALE LOTS: A total of 30 pens of broilers will make the auction. No exhibitor will be awarded more than one sale slot in the top Youth Livestock Auction. - 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- 2. **ASSOCIATION:** The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Blvd., St. Joseph, MO 64506, (816) 233-3101, will participate in premiums offered for classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in conjunction to the premiums offered by the Fair. A minimum of fifty (50) head must be shown in the division to receive AAA premium support for the following year. Premiums from the association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the association's portion of premiums.
 - i. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the AAA are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules can be found at www. angus.org.
 - **ii.** All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
 - **iii. REGISTRATION:** Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for check-in at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted only the original certificates issued by the AAA.
 - iv. GROOMING: Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.
 - v.  - i. Any individual who has an entry in a BPG approved show must be a member of the Beefmaster Promotion Group and must be at least 6 years of age as of the day of the show.
 - ii. All cattle must be registered with BBU.
 - iii. Only one (1) person per animal is permitted in the show arena during the exhibition of individual classes, with exceptions made by one of the following: a.) A physical or mental disability that prevents the proper handling of the animal without assistance or, b.) a handler has a physical injury (sprained ankle, broken arm, etc.) that requires assistance. Any request for an assistant shall be presented to an attending BPG Director or Officer before the beginning of the show for a ruling. In the event that an assistant is required and approved, the assistant shall provide the least amount of interference as possible for the handler to properly display the animal and shall not interfere with any other entrant or otherwise block the path or view of the Judge.
 - **iv.** All animal tattoos may be checked for legibility and must match the registration papers for that animal. Animals with illegible tattoos or incorrect papers will not be allowed to show.
 - v. Heifers exhibited at 24 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy or be nursing their natural calf-at side (under 6 months of age).
 - vi. All bulls 12 months and older must be led with a nose-lead at all times.
 - vii. Animals entered in group classes, must have been shown in an individual class.
 - viii.All BBU registered animals must be shown with their hair coats lying downward and flat against their entire body. Hair trimming is permissible and must be done in those few areas such as the neck and portions of the topline of the animal which may not lay flat against the body. Hair may not be trained upwards or forwards and/or pulled upwards or forwards on any part of the animal's body. No animals may have any foreign object(s) attached to it in any manner or have its natural color altered in a manner so as to change the conformation or appearance. An exhibitor who fails to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit premiums, awards and points from the show.
 - ix. Each animal must be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. - 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS:** Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- 2. ASSOCIATION: American Brahman Breeders Association, 3003 S Loop Ste 520, Houston, TX, 77054, 713-349-0854
 - i. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders Association to be eligible to compete in association sponsored shows. The registration certificate for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or manager of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
 - ii. The registration number and animal identification number (number branded on animal) of (1) each animal must be entered in an individual class, (2) the sire of each get-of-sire entry and (3) the dam of each produce-of-dam entry must be listed on the entry card of each animal entered. All offspring born in 2021 must be parent verified with official stamped registration papers from ABBA.
 - **iii.** Entries that have not complied with rules one (1) and two (2) will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the association's Register of Renown.
 - iv. Animals shown in group classes must also be entered and shown in individual classes.
 - v. Entries will be listed numerically according to age (oldest first) in catalogs and judging schedules. Include animal identification number (number brand) as a part of identification. When entering the arena for judging, the handlers will line cattle up numerically in the same order.
 - vi. Judges will be allowed to comment on placings in selected classes when conditions permit.
 - vii. Each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical or circulatory constriction including banding or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Injections of foreign substances for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited. If to the satisfaction of the ABBA's staff, Officers, Executive Committee or Board of Directors; any animal has had its natural conformation and structure altered or been administered steroids, growth hormones or stimulants; then said animal shall be ruled ineligible to compete until such time the show committee and owner/owners have reviewed the case. Any violators, both owner and fitter will be ineligible to exhibit cattle at ABBA approved shows for 5 years.
 - viii. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc., are operated as a unit under the same management but have cattle also registered in the name of individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership brand, are eligible to be shown in competition under the firm name provided they have not been and will not be shown in the name of the individuals.
 - ix. For females being shown in the three oldest classes **CURRENT YEAR LESS 3 YEARS** (females calved Sept. 1 August 31, 2019 for Fall Shows), exhibitor must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian and will be presented to show officials at time of check-in or registration paper check. The show reserves the right to perform pregnancy determination by palpation for females in the above classes at any given ABBA approved show if an official protest has been filed. For Fall Shows only the last class of females is required to have a calf at side. The only exemption from this rule will be cows that have already weaned a calf and a registration certificate of the calf MUST be presented to the judge.
 - x. All bulls will be shown with a nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached. For bulls showing in the oldest class, the exhibitor must have a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian stating the bull has produced viable semen. This certificate must be available for inspection by the judge on request.
 - xi. No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one produce or embryo produce of dam, per dam.
 - **xii.** Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in a lactating stage. Calves must be shown and exhibited with their dams and said calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging.
 - xiii. Cattle will not be allowed to show if their switches have been balled or glitter applied to their skin.

- xiv. In the get-of-sire and produce-of-dam classes, breeders will not be allowed to show cattle of mixed color. They will be entered as to the color division they are assigned by the Color Committee for the show. If so, the following procedure will apply. All grey cattle and solid black cattle will show grey. Red, black and white speckled or red and white speckled cattle will show red. Cattle with questionable colored pigmentation may be entered in the color division the breeder selects, however, said cattle are subject to inspection by a three member ABBA committee. If the Color Committee disagrees with the breeder, the pedigree of said animal will then be used to aid in the final determination, but color pigmentation will take preference. In those cases, where questionable colored cattle possess both red and grey breeding, then the committee will make the final determination. The decision of the committee is final. Once animals have been classified they will remain in that classification unless they were young at time of classification and it is apparent that they have changed their color. In the get-of-sire and produce-of-dam classes, breeders will be allowed to show cattle of varying color. They will be entered as to the color division of the sire in case of get-of-sire and dam in case of produce-of-dam. In other words, if a get is mixed red and grey and the sire was red; then the get will be entered in the red division show. At split shows where the color committee is not present, a staff member with (2) ABBA directors will clarify questionable colored cattle for that particular show. The final classification will be done by the Color Committee. {Revised 08/99}
- xv. The owner of record of any registered animal entered in an ABBA approved shows and/or his/her agent, exhibitor, fitter, handler and/or representative releases ABBA and its representatives from any and all liability that seller/owner might claim as a result of injury of any kind sustained before, during, or after handling cattle for any ABBA board approved activity.
- xvi. For shows to remain approved ABBA point shows, show must maintain 75 head average for previous 2 years.
- **xvii.** The official ABBA rules and procedures governing showing and exhibiting of registered Brahman cattle supersede any rules printed in any show catalog.
- **xviii.** In an attempt to insure that all animals receive an equal evaluation at the National and International Shows, classes with more than 30 entries may at the discretion of the Show Management and/or ABBA Officials be split by age as evenly as possible.
- xix. Any animal that exceeds the weight & measurement requirements at the International Brahman Show, National Brahman Show or any other designated show where weights & measurements are taken will be ineligible to show at any future ABBA approved shows until they reach the Junior Division. Any animal that exceeds the parameters and is shown at an ABBA approved show before reaching the Junior Division will be ineligible to show their remaining career. Both the exhibitor and owner of the previously disqualified animal that is shown before reaching the Junior Division will be ineligible to show their animals for 13 months following the infraction.

PRE-JUNIOR & JUNIOR MINIATURE HEREFORD HEIFER & STEER SHOW 2021 RULES AND REGULATIONS

 RULES AND REGULATIONS: General rules and regulations of individual shows apply to this division as well as those listed.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY:

- **a.** To be eligible to exhibit, the youth must be three (3) years of age but not nineteen (19) on the date of the show. Birth certificates may be required at time of arrival.
- **b.** Exhibitors must be current active members of the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association. Siblings may share family membership.
- c. Steers must be registered in the AHA and meet height restrictions in order to participate.
- d. Prospect Steers will not have exceeded (16) months of age as of the day of the show exhibiting.
- e. Market steers must exceed (16) months of age and not exceed (30) months as of the day of the show exhibiting.

3. OWNERSHIP:

- a. Ownership of prospect steers must be established by September 1, 2021.
- b. Ownership of Market steers must be established by May 1, 2021.
- c. Animals must be in the name of the exhibitor
- d. Animals with pending or applied registration are not eligible to show.
- e. Steers must be registered with the AHA and have AHA registration papers.

4. POSSESSION, CARE & FEEDING:

- **a.** Animals entered must be in the possession of the exhibitor no later than the above dates. The exhibitor is responsible for the general custody, care and feeding of their animal when possible, or to help when it is not possible to care for the animal unassisted. Family members and fellow participants may help with these tasks.
- **b.** All animals in this division MUST be completely broke to lead for the safety of the exhibitor and others in the show ring. Animals not deemed fit will be removed from the show ring and disqualified from the competition.

5. FITTING OF ANIMAL:

- **a.** All animals will be fitted and be presented in proper condition for a beef show. Exhibitors are encouraged to help in any way that is safe and possible for them to do so, but not endanger either themselves, their animals, or others in the process.
- **b.** Alteration of conformation and structure by prohibited substance or unethical fitting is prohibited. Any violation of this rule will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.
- **c.** The injection, use or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.
- **d.** Any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injections or ingested material not conductive to the continued health or marketability of beef carcasses or for deception will result in immediate disqualification without recourse.
- **e.** Every participant in consideration of their entry being accepted by the show, specifically represents that no animal entered is misrepresented in any way except trimming of feet and blocking of hair.

6. OFFICIAL HEIGHT & WEIGHT:

- **a.** All entries, steers and heifers, will be measured at a designated time and location. The weight recorded at the time of check-in will be the official weight and height of the animal.
- b. The MHBA reserves the right, at its discretion, to check the weight and height of any animal.
- **c.** Mature females cannot measure more than 45" at the point of their hip. Mature males cannot measure more than 48" at the point of their hip. Entries exceeding the height restriction will be disqualified.
- **d.** Prospect steers less than 16 months of age as of the day of show will be divided by weight into classes of light, medium, and heavy by a MBHA representative.
- **e.** Market steers 16 months of age and not exceeding 30 months as of the day of show will be divided by weight into classes of light, medium, and heavy by a MBHA representative.

7. SHOWING OF ANIMALS:

- **a.** Exhibitors may have one person to assist with exhibiting their animal. An assistant may be a parent, adult, sibling, or another junior exhibitor.
- b. Exhibitors may NOT have an assistant in the showmanship class.
- c. The exhibitors are to handle the showing, one show stick per animal and the use of the show stick is only to be done by the pre-junior/junior exhibitor. The assistant's role is for safety reasons only and is not allowed to assist with the setup of the cattle (ex. The assistant cannot take control of the show stick/halter to set up the animal or use the halter to lift and set the head).
- 8. **SHOW HARNESS:** All exhibitors will be required to wear a show number harness for each animal shown in a class to hold the number in plain sight.

9. SHOWMANSHIP:

- **a.** Any exhibitor who shows unassisted may compete in this class.
- **b.** Animal must be owned and entered by participant to show in this class.

 - i. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered with the Santa Gertrudis Association, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows as approved by the board.
 - **ii.** Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. This means the active or junior member has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on their account.
 - iii. ALL animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and one (1) from the Breed Standards Committee.
 - iv. Heifers 24 months of age or older must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician.
 - v. A cow shown with calf at side:
 - vi. Calf must be her natural calf meeting the Standard of Excellence.
 - vii. Calf must be registered if older than 30 days. If calf is less than 30 days of age it is subject to registration.
 - viii. All senior bull classes (late junior yearling bull and over) must have either a nose ring or nose clip for show purposes.
 - ix. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo and/or numerical fire or freeze brand.
 - x. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. *Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show. Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped (no steer or Brahman clips) and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tailhead clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.); trim tail (no shear except back side). Fitting handbook should be studied.
 - xi. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
 - **xii.** Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
 - xiii. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show.
 - **xiv.** To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue.
 - **xv.** There must be at least 5 exhibitors and 25 head of cattle, or a minimum of 50 head of cattle, to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
 - xvi. Shows in which 50 head or less are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at discretion of show officials
 - xvii. Classes with over 30 entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
 - xviii. The judge must be an SGBI approved judge.
 - **xix.** Dress for exhibitors participating in SGBI sanctioned Open and Youth shows shall be of neat and clean clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midriffs showing and appropriate footwear no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded no caps.

- xx. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, pharmaceutical or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid diuretic or any other substance is allowed. ALL animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.
- **xxi.** If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures in herdsmanship paper.
- xxii. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his/her entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him/her to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
- xxiii. Any person who furnished the birthday of an animal to SGBI either on the IPRA or some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in an AGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than thirty (30) days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one (1) year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be shown again.
- **xxiv.** For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgments, either past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision therefrom.
- **xxv.** Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any text, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with the procedures established by the rules.

xxvi. APPEALS:

- The Chairman of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and the Vice President of Youth Activities in conjunction
 with the person(s) responsible for coordinating the individual shows will continue to be primarily vested with
 authority to determine whether animals entered shows meet the standards formally approved by the Breed
 Standards Committee.
- In the event the Vice President of Youth Activities or individual show coordinating official disqualifies an animal
 from participating in a youth show and the exhibitor wants to appeal the disqualification, the appeal process
 outlined below must be followed.
- In the event the Chairman of Shows and Exhibits or individual show coordinating official disqualifies an animal from participating in a sanctioned show, and the exhibitor wants to appeal the disqualification, the appeal process outlined below must be followed.
- Additionally, any exhibitor participating in an individual youth show or other SGBI sanctioned show that wants
 to appeal a breed standards disqualification decision by either the Vice President for Youth Activities/youth
 show coordinating official or the Chairman of Shows and Exhibits/show coordinating official must follow the
 appeals process outlined below.

a. APPEALS COMMITTEE

The appeals committee will be comprised by the following three (3) members - Vice President of Breed Improvement, the Vice President of Marketing and Promotions and the Executive Director of SGBI. All three
 (3) members must be present to constitute a quorum. All decisions rendered by the Appeals Committee will be binding and final for all appeals submitted to the committee.

b. APPEALS PROCEDURE

- All qualification/disqualification appeals and appropriate supporting documentation submitted by exhibitors
 must be submitted in writing to the Executive Director of SGBI. The written appeal must be accompanied
 by a \$200 process fee. No waivers will be granted to the requirements for written appeals and the up front
 \$200 fee.
- Exhibitors must file written appeals postmarked or via e-mail within five (5) business days following the date of the show governing the qualification/disqualification decision by the primary officials (Vice President of Youth Activities/show coordinating official or Chairman of Shows and Exhibits/event coordinating official).
- The Executive Director will be responsible for coordinating meetings of the Appeals Committee and forwarding copies of the appeal and supporting documentation to the other committee members.
- The Appeals Committee will render a final decision within five (5) business days following receipt of the written appeal, appropriate supporting documentation and the \$200 fee.

- In the event an exhibitor appeals a disqualification decision by the primary official and the Appeal Committee approves the exhibitor's appeal, the animal covered by the appeal will be qualified to participate in all future SGBI sanctioned events.
- In the event an exhibitor appeals a disqualification decision by the primary official and the Appeals Committee disapproves the exhibitor's appeal, the animal covered by the appeal will be disqualified from participating in future SGBI sanctioned events. Additionally, any points or awards previously given to the owner of the animal will be forfeited.
- In the event an exhibitor appeals a qualification decision by the primary official and the Appeals Committee
 rules that the animal covered by the appeal does not meet breed standards, the covered animal will be
 disqualified from participating in future shows and the owner of the animal will forfeit any points and awards
 previously granted.

xxvii. PROCEDURES TO FILE PROTEST:

- **ab.** File protest with show that infraction occurred. Follow their protest rules.
- ac. File the same protest with the Shows and Exhibits Committee. Contact the chairman.
- ad. Three (3) exhibitors must sign the protest.
- **ae.** All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Shows and Exhibits Committee within twenty four (24) hours after the occasion for such protest.
- af. Order of hearing a protest:
 - i. Chairman of Shows and Exhibits Committee
 - ii. Action by Shows and Exhibits Committee
 - iii. Final action by Board of Directors
 - iv. Follow appeal procedure as outlined in Rules and Regulations.
- **ag.** All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the Shows and Exhibits Committee shall be subject to the following penalties:
 - i. Loss of premium money.
 - ii. Loss of awards
 - iii. Suspension from showing the subject animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one (1) show, two (2) shows or three (3) shows, or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.
 - iv. Suspension of the exhibitor being the same as the other SGBI Rules and penalties.
 - Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules, and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.
- xxxiv. DISQUALIFICATIONS: An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show officials may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him/her may be moved up (at the option of the Shows and Exhibits Committee) to fill the vacated position.

XXXV. RULES FOR HIGH POINT AWARDS:

- a. For each point show, 1st=2 pts; 2nd=1 pt; Division Champion= 3 pts; Res. Division Champion=2 pts; Grand Champion= 5 pts; and Res Grand Champion= 4 pts; Best of Polled=1 pt, but does not count toward overall points
- b. Get of Sire and Produce of Dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards.
- c. Points will stay with animal if sold.
- d. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring.
- e. All points earned at the National Open Show are to be doubled.
- **xxxvi. SHOW RING CONDUCT:** If any exhibitor/owner/showman interferes in any way with the judge or shows disrespect to him/her, or to the show in the ring, the exhibitor/owner/showman may be dismissed by the judge or show management from the ring. The management may withhold premium monies that may have been awarded.
- **xxxvii.DNA TESTING:** Santa Gertrudis Breeders International and its representatives reserve the right to require any test deemed necessary to verify the accuracy of entry, classification and/or the pedigree of exhibited Santa Gertrudis, including calves exhibited at the side.

SHOW REQUIREMENTS

- 1. **RULES/REGULATIONS**: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and Youth Livestock Show Special Rules and Beef Heifer Rules.
- 2. VALIDATION: To be eligible, heifers must be validated with and adhere to all the rules of the Texas 4-H and FFA Breeding Heifer Validation Program administered by the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas Education Agency, Department of Agriculture Education. Exhibitors need to check with their local County Extension Agent or Agriculture Science Teacher for local/county validation deadlines. http://texasyouthlivestock.com/heifer-validation/. All State Fair of Texas youth heifer shows will adhere to the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- 3. **OWNERSHIP:** Animals must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor no later than June 30 of the current year.
- 4. **REGISTRATION:** Each animal shown in this division must be registered. An original certificate of registration must be kept available at all times for check in and during the show for each animal exhibited. Application for transfer and pending registration will not be accepted. All heifers must be exhibited in the designated breed division in which they are validated under.
- **5. REGISTRATION PAPERS:** An exhibitor must have original registration paper(s) physically in hand during <u>ALL</u> exhibitions or it will result in an automatic disqualification.
- **6. ENTRY LIMITATION:** There is no entry limitation for beef heifers.
- 7. **EAR TAGS:** All ear tags must be removed. Tags associated with county/local shows or state/federal regulatory programs are acceptable. Heifer identification will be based on ear tattoos or brands only.
- **8. GROOMING:** This is a blow and go show. No clippers requiring an electrical outlet are permitted. Animals are to be shown in natural conformation and color. Grooming materials leaving any residue are not permitted. All cattle must be dehorned and show no secondary horn growth in excess of one inch
- 9. TIE OUTS: A limited number of tie out spaces will be sold on a first come first serve basis. Tie outs may be purchased at time of entry or from the Livestock Office after arrival deadline, pending availability. Tie outs will be assigned upon arrival when the exhibitor provides proof of purchase to the superintendent. Cattle will not be removed to tie outs until 7PM daily. All cattle in tie-outs MUST wear a neck-tie. Cattle are limited to the assigned tie-out areas. Tie-out fees must be paid for, in advance, before using tie-outs. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning before/after use as necessary.

10. EQUIPMENT:

- No fans permitted in any pedestrian aisle, walkway or stall. No rear fans permitted. No exceptions. All fans must be hung using 'L' brackets.
- No generators permitted.
- No Portacools or similar cooling devices allowed.
- Grooming chutes may be brought on the grounds during the beef heifer shows provided a permit is purchased. Fee is to be paid at the time entries are made. Space for chutes will be in stalls. No chutes permitted in any pedestrian aisle.
- 11. RELEASE: Releases will be written upon arrival according to release times specific to each breed.

ASSOCIATION: American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Blvd., St. Joseph, MO 64506, (816) 233-3101, will participate in premiums offered according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show.
 - i. Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeder's Reference Guide of the Association. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.
 - ii. REGISTRATION: Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
 - **iii.** All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type tests to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
 - iv. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.
 - v. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.
 - **vi.** Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have the original registration certificate at check in.
 - vii. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
 - viii. To be eligible for Association premiums heifer entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.
 - ix. Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

- 2. ENTRY LIMITATION: There is no entry limitation. All animals entered must be physically castrated males.
- 3. **OWNERSHIP:** All entries must be owned and continuously cared for by the exhibitor from June 30 through the show date of the Fair.
- **4. VALIDATION:** This show will adhere to the recommendations of the Texas Youth Livestock Validation Program. Failure to abide by these rules will result in disqualification.
- 5. CHECK-IN: Exhibitors must check-in with pre-distributed weight cards including state validation tag number, weight, and declared breed. Check-in must be completed by deadline on check-in day, or be subject to disqualification. Upon completion of check-in, exhibitors will receive a two additional class cards. One class card will be required to show/ consign animal; the second class card can be retained for exhibitor records or as a receipt. Once an exhibitor has officially checked-in and left the kiosk, the entry is final; no further changes can be made.
- 6. CLASSIFICATION: Exhibitors will declare a primary and secondary breed choice at check-in. Declaration changes by the exhibitor will not be allowed at any time. Steers are subject to reclassification by a three-member committee. *See Classification Guidelines **Decisions of official veterinarians, classifiers, and/or officials are final.
- 7. **EAR TAGS:** Steers must have a Texas State Validation ear tag. Only validation tags will be allowed. All other tags must be removed prior to arrival.
 - a. RE-TAG: If an animal is missing the Texas State Validation ear tag upon arrival, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to take the animal to the designated location on check-in day for retag. Any ear tags damaged post check-in deadline must be reported to a State Fair or validation official WITH the damaged tag to purchase a replacement tag.
- **8. UNMANAGEABLE ANIMALS:** State Fair may disqualify any animal deemed unmanageable. Any animal escaping the control of it's exhibitor may be dismissed from the show ring by a show official at any time.



RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in this division shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and Department Requirements as published in this exhibitor handbook. This show is an Alpaca and Llama Show Association (ALSA) approved show sponsored by South Central Llama Association (SCLA). All rules and guidelines for this show not covered by the State Fair of Texas Rules and Regulations will be in accordance to the current ALSA Handbook.
- 2. ENTRY APPLICATION/FEE: Entries must be completed entirely online. Online entry fee is \$20/class with the addition of a \$5/head ALSA fee. Entry fees are not stall fees; stalls are additionally purchased. Late entries will be accepted until check-in deadline, for fee per class equal to two times the entry fee. An ALSA membership card must be presented at registration or a \$50 adult fee and \$15 youth ALSA fee will apply.

- 3. **OWNERSHIP:** Exhibitors must be the registered owners and make entry in the exact names (owner and animal) as they appear on the registration certificate. An exhibitor may or may not be the handler. Youth division entries must be made in the name of the youth.
- 4. REGISTRATION: An original certificate of registration must be presented to the superintendent prior to the check-in deadline and kept available at all times during the show for each animal exhibited. All llamas, with the exception of youth, performance and non-breeder classes, must be registered or have passed screening with the International Llama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). All llamas have to be registered with the ILR. Non-breeding llamas and llamas used in youth or performance classes do not have to be registered or have passed screening with the ILR or CLRC.
- 5. STALLS: Stalls are \$50 each, and purchased at time of entry. Stalling requests must be submitted at time of entry on stall request form. Limit two head per stall (not including cria 5 months or younger). There is no guarantee that stall requests can or will be honored.
- 6. **BEDDING:** Exhibitors will be provided a coupon from the show superintendent that may be redeemed for first bedding material through the State Fair Feed Store on the grounds on the day of arrival only. **No outside bedding (including but not limited to bagged or baled wood shavings or chips and small square baled straw) will be permitted on the grounds.** Equivalents will be available from the State Fair Feed Store.
- 7. WOOL DIVISIONS: Llamas will be divided into three divisions based on length of wool.
 - **a.** Suri Wool: natural balanced, athletic type; natural luster, hand and drape over the body, usually forming a natural part along the spine.
 - **b.** Light-Medium Wool: minimal to moderate body wool, short to minimal neck wool w/ smooth to moderate leg wool.
 - c. Heavy Wool: abundant body & neck wool w/ minimal to abundant leg wool. (i.e., leg wool at least to knee & hock.)
- 8. NON-BREEDER: All ages and wool classifications of gelded males or surgically spayed females to be judged on soundness, conformation, and disposition. Non-breeding llamas must be accompanied by a registration or veterinarian certificate verifying gelded or spayed status. If three or less entries per class, classes may be combined.
- **9. ADVANCE/MASTER PERFORMANCE:** Open to all entries who meet the specific criteria for the respective ALSA approved class. A llama may be entered only once in either advance/master or youth classes.
- **10. NOVICE PERFORMANCE:** Open to all entries who meet the specific criteria for the respective ALSA approved class. A llama may be entered in only either novice or junior classes
- 11. YOUTH ALSA: All ALSA youth ages 7-18 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. An ALSA youth who

becomes 7 during the year is eligible to show as of his/her birthday. For youth performance and showmanship classes, ALSA points will be credited to the handler. Youth ALSA number must be included on entry application. The age divisions at any show may be combined if there are fewer than 8 total entries in any two of the age categories. Please be prepared to provide proof of age with a birth certificate.

- 12. PREMIER EXHIBITOR: Premier Exhibitor will be calculated from the exhibitor's placement, in individual classes only, as follows: 1st=4 pts, 2nd=3 pts, 3rd=2 pts, 4th=1 pt. In case of a tie, 5th place will count. No entry fee, premium, or ALSA points. Llamas may not be entered more than once in the same class.

- 2. RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in this division shall be subject to and each exhibitor agrees to abide by the General Rules and Regulations and the Pan American Poultry Show Requirements as published in this exhibitor handbook.
- **3.** The American Standard of Perfection as revised by the American Poultry Association will be used as the guide in judging of this division.
- 4. ENTRY APPLICATION/FEE: Entries must be completed entirely online. Online entry fee is \$5/entry.
- 5. ADMISSION/PARKING: All exhibitors are required to purchase an admission pass and parking permit for the duration of each show entered unless complimentary admission applies. Please see "Admission and Parking" in the General Rules Section of this Exhibitor Handbook. When a request for credentials to be mailed is indicated on the entry application and the mail fee is included with all other fees, passes will be mailed to the exhibitor. No credentials will be mailed after Opening Day. Credential delivery date is not guaranteed. All other credentials must be picked up in designated location after unloading. ALL LIVESTOCK & POULTRY ARE REQUIRED TO ENTER THROUGH GATE 15.
- 6. HEALTH REQUIREMENT: Only birds of Texas origin are permitted to exhibit. All animals entering Fair Park must comply with the requirements of the State Fair of Texas Animal Health Regulations. A negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 30 (thirty) days or from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program or the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP). Poultry must originate from areas where reportable avian diseases are not known to have been active within the last 30 (thirty) days. All exhibitors must provide original documentation to animal health officials and/or show management upon arrival. Forms must be kept available with exhibit at all times during the show.
- 7. Birds to be entered in Showmanship and/or the Rooster Crowing Contest must be entered in the Pan American Poultry Show and ARE subject to the same health and arrival/release requirements. Each bird may only be entered be one exhibitor in showmanship.
- 8. SHIPPING: Express shipments will not be accepted.
- **9. EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES:** Exhibitors are not permitted to place advertising material on the coops occupied with entries. Entries are not to be handled by anyone except the judge and/or owners.
- **10. SUBSTITUTIONS:** Changes and substitutions may be accommodated upon arrival. Substitutions must be within the same breed, variety and sex.
- **11. LATE ENTRIES:** A \$25 fee will be added to each entry application after September 1. NO late entries will be accepted after Opening Day of the Fair.
- **12. CLASSES:** Classes will be provided for all breeds/varieties currently recognized by the American Bantam Association and American Poultry Association. Any incomplete entry will be assigned to an "All Other Breeds" class for judging. The following pages outline offerings for the Standard, Bantam, Duck, Geese, Turkey and Guinea Shows.
- 13. JUDGE'S RESPONSIBILITIES: In the opinion of the judge, if an exhibit is unworthy of first award, the judge must give the exhibit the appropriate award. If unworthy of any award listed in the premium list, the judge must so designate
- **14. JUDGING:** The order of judging will be established by the Superintendent and completed on the following day, if necessary. All cages must be unlocked from 9AM through the conclusion of judging on Saturday. Cages that have been locked by the exhibitor (zip ties, hog rings, etc) will not be opened by the judge or show officials for the purpose of placing the birds.

CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

- 1. RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each contestant agrees to abide by the General and Youth Rules and Regulations of the State Fair of Texas as published in this exhibitor handbook and the following special rules.
- 2. **PURPOSE:** To provide an opportunity for 4-H and FFA members to display projects constructed in agricultural mechanics labs; to promote the development of skills in agricultural mechanics through competition; to recognize individual and group accomplishments in the area of agricultural mechanics; and to provide an opportunity for public appreciation of this important sector of 4-H and FFA Youth Programs.
- 3. **ELIGIBILITY:** Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA, FCCLA and 4-H members. Any contestant violating any rule will be disqualified from the contest. Projects exhibited must have been constructed by 4-H/FFA members under direct supervision of the CEA/AST, either as a part of their agricultural mechanics instruction in agricultural science or as a part of their supervised work experience program. Group (team) or individual entries are accepted. Group entries must consist of members from the same county or chapter. Groups will consist of at least two and no more than six members. A team Youth Liability and Indemnity Form, signed by CEA/AST is due at time of entry.
- **4. ENTRY LIMITATION:** Each contestant may enter two individual projects and no more than one per class. Each group of students may enter no more than two group constructed projects and may have no more than one entry in any project class. No individual contestant may enter more than four projects total.
- 5. OWNERSHIP: Projects may have been individually or group constructed and may be individually or chapter owned.
- 6. **INELIGIBLE PROJECTS:** Any project that does not fit into one of the stated classes will be disqualified by the show committee.
- 7. **SUBSTITUTIONS:** All project substitutions must be made at check in with the superintendent. Substitutions will not be allowed after check-in deadline. See Youth Show Rules for contestant substitution rules.
- **8. CONSTRUCTION DATE (AG MECH):** A project can be exhibited only one time at the State Fair of Texas. All projects must be started on or after April 1 of the previous calendar year (18 months prior to show date).
- **9. RESTORATION DATE (TRACTORS):** A tractor can be exhibited only one time at the State Fair of Texas. All restoration projects must be started on or after October 1 of two prior calendar years (24 months prior to show date).
- 10. PROJECT PRESENTATION: All projects must be painted or properly treated and must be clean and in a presentable condition, even though they may have been used. Due to limited exhibit space, trailers and other equipment are to be displayed in transport position. Operation of ramps, extensions, and other special features may be demonstrated only as directed by the official judges and as space permits. No additional floor space will be provided for podiums, chairs, tables, show boxes, etc. No touch up painting of any type will be allowed.
- **11. PROJECT COMPLETENESS:** All projects should be complete including finish. Any item, necessary for use of the project, must be a part of it (example: hinges and latches on gates and panels) including documentation.
- 12. CONTESTANT PRESENTATION/SHOWMANSHIP: Contestants should be dressed appropriately and be with their project when it is judged. Contestants should be courteous and helpful to those viewing their project, including those exhibiting next to them. Contestants should not interfere with or shield those who are exhibiting next to them. Contestants should be available to answer questions when their project is being judged. Knowledge of the project will be evaluated at this time. Contestants should be well informed of the project they are representing, but should not be boisterous or argumentative. Contestants should provide any equipment that may be necessary to judge their project (flashlights, mat or creeper for judging projects that the judge would need to get underneath such as trailers). Contestants may be requested to hold measuring tape and assist the judge in making measurements on projects. An anonymous judge will award showmanship.
- **13. DOCUMENTATION:** An original (contestant-drawn) plan and drawing, a bill of materials and photographs showing all phases of construction are to be provided with projects. TxDOT and/or ASABE regulations and specifications are to be provided as they apply to individual projects. Display of plans, photos, etc. must be done in such a manner that no additional floor space is required. Stands, podiums, etc. will be permitted only when they can be positioned on or

- under the project.
- **14. SIGNS:** All projects will be identified with SFT entry number cards. Additional signs, banners, etc. are encouraged, but are subject to approval by the Committee. No "For Sale" signs will be permitted.
- **15. EXHIBIT SPACE:** Due to limited exhibit space, please note space requirements on the entry form. Final space allotment is at the superintendent's discretion.
- **16. GENERAL SAFETY:** Flammable and/or combustible liquids shall not be used, stored or sprayed inside any State Fair of Texas building at any time. This shall include, but is not limited to, enamel paints, thinners, reducers, gasoline or any other petroleum based liquids. All liquids must be in properly labeled original containers. All compressed gas cylinders shall be properly secured in place. Hand wheels are to be removed. Protective caps must be installed and taped. No regulators or hoses are to be installed at any time. No extension cords allowed.
- 17. PROJECT SAFETY: Appropriate and safe display stands must be provided for gates, panels, and other projects that need support. Sharp edges and points, such as found on self feeder roofs, bale movers, etc., are to be padded or covered as necessary to prevent injury. All trailers and other equipment that is to be operated and/or transported on public roads are to be equipped with safety equipment specified in Title 7, Vehicles and Traffic Transportation Code of Texas Statutes, Specific chapters regarding width (621.201), lights and reflectors (545.106, 547.324 and 547.331), brakes (547.401), length (621.201) and inspection (621.204) are to be adhered to. Any trailer that exceeds 102 inches in width must have a signed permit. All towed equipment, regardless of standards, is to be equipped with safety chains. All three-point hitch and P.T.O. operated equipment are to meet current ASABE standards. The IMS WEB page will provide information on how to access or acquire TxDOT Equipment and Vehicle Registrations, and ASABE Standards. (www-ims.tamu.edu)
- 18. ELECTRICAL SAFETY: All 120 VAC and higher electrical plugs and receptacles are to be the equipment grounding type. All metal components are to be grounded. Ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCI) shall be provided for all 120 VAC receptacles. All 50 VAC and higher connections are to be protected in appropriate indoor or outdoor rated enclosures.
- **19. OFFLOADING ASSISTANCE:** If the project can be removed safely from the trailer, the State Fair of Texas will provide assistance to unload the project. Unloading assistance is left to the discretion of the Superintendents.
- **20. TRAILER REGISTRATION:** Current registration plates or one trip permits and paper plates are required on all trailers that are towed to the project show. Hauled trailers will be exempt from this rule.
- 21. PROJECTS WITH ENGINES: There is to be no more than two gallons of fuel in any fuel tank. The fuel tank cap is to be in place and sealed with tape. The battery is to be disconnected. This applies to all engines in the exhibit area.
- **22. ELECTRICITY:** There will be limited to no electrical supply provided by the show. Equipment should have an internal power supply for demonstrations
- **23. VEHICLES:** Tractors, trucks or other vehicles (including non-entered trailers) are not allowed in the exhibit area as part of the display.
- **24. LOSS OR DAMAGE:** Every precaution will be taken to protect the projects entered; however, neither the SFT, its management, superintendents nor judges of this division will be responsible for any loss or damage to projects.

26. TRACTOR RESTORATION LIMITATIONS:

- **a.** No yard tractors or riding lawnmowers.
- **b.** Tractors with steel lugs contestants must provide mats or lumber/plywood to serve as runners to protect asphalt and concrete from damage.
- c. Tractor Serial Number must be included with description on SFT Entry Form.

27. JUDGING CRITERIA for Tractor Restoration projects:

- a. <u>Aesthetics: 15 points</u>. Overall appearance of tractor, including workmanship and finish. Items that will be considered include, but are not limited to the following:
- · Metal preparation prior to painting
- Completeness of all sheet metal
- Painting and finish

- Detail and completeness of components steering wheels, seats, decals, instrument panels, wiring harness, etc.
- **b.** Authentic: 10 points. Must be as original as possible. To include:
- · Paint color, fasteners, and other components such as magnetos, carburetors, exhaust systems
- Mechanical systems, fuel, electrical, engine, transmission, final drive, cooling, etc.
- Serial plates in place with unaltered serial numbers
- **c.** <u>Mechanical: 40 points</u>. To include the mechanical restoration of all systems, including: (some tractors may not have all systems)
- · Engine, transmission, final drive
- Fuel, cooling, ignition, lighting, exhaust, charging, starting, hydraulic and steering systems
- Contestants may be asked to start the tractor and drive it, demonstrating all gears along with systems (hydraulics, lights, brakes, etc.). Driving and mechanical evaluation will be done outside when offloading on Monday.
 Contestants may be asked to move tractors back outside for additional driving and mechanical evaluation on Tuesday.
- A *Mechanical Check Sheet*, which tractor judges use in their evaluation, will be posted on the website as soon as it becomes available. These score sheets will include (a) checks on systems: engine transmission final drive brakes/steering lights/safety equipment cranking/charging and PTO/lift/hydraulics; and (b) observations made when tractors are driven.
- **d.** <u>Safety Equipment: 5 points.</u> All equipment that was original to the tractor should be in place (includes all shields and decals). Tractor must be in safe operating condition. To exhibit a tractor, the following safety considerations must be followed:
- No more than 2 gallons of fuel in the fuel tank
- Neat and functional drip pans containing floor absorbent material (cat litter) to collect any coolant, oil, or hydraulics that may drip from the tractor
- Fuel shut-off valves, under all fuel tanks, must be functional and all tractors must be exhibited with these valves
 off
- An approved ABC fire extinguisher with a minimum of 5 lb. capacity must be provided and placed near the tractor
- Tractors may be started only at the request of show officials
- **e.** <u>Documentation: 15 points.</u> Documentation must be typed (recommend word document or spreadsheet) and include the following: (The National FFA Tractor Restoration Competition documentation format may be used.)
 - One page description of the overall restoration project
- Expense report identifying all costs involved in the restoration
- Photos (before, during, after) safe working environments should be depicted in all photos
- Mechanic's report detailing all mechanical work performed
- All documentation is to be arranged in a three-ring notebook, divided and sequenced with a table of contents and page numbers.
- f. <u>Knowledge: 10 points.</u> Judges will ask questions to determine the contestant/contestants knowledge of and involvement in the restoration.
- **g.** <u>Presentation: 5 points.</u> Showmanship includes meeting public, eye contact, introduction, and enthusiasm for describing tractor, articulation and confidence.

CONTEST DESCRIPTION

This is a challenge based contest. Some known challenges will be released prior to the contest, and the remaining on contest day. Teams build and program their robot for known challenges prior to the contest. On contest day, the remaining unknown challenges will be revealed and teams will be given time to build and program the robot to account for the newly revealed challenges.

Known challenges will be posted at bigtex.com/livestock no later than one week before the Fair's Opening Day.

CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

- 1. RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each contestant agrees to abide by the General and Youth Rules and Regulations of the State Fair of Texas as published in this exhibitor handbook and the following special rules.
- 2. ENTRY LIMITATION: Due to space limitations, only the first forty (40) teams entered will be accepted. After forty (40) entries are received, additional entries will be placed on a waiting list subject to space availability. Late entries submitted after August 25, are subject to space availability; late fees are double the original fee. NO late entries will be accepted after Opening Day.
- 3. **ELIGIBILITY:** Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA and 4-H members. Any contestant violating any rule will be disqualified from the contest along with his or her team. Teams must consist of members from the same county or chapter. Three (3) to six (6) students may constitute a team in this contest. Junior contestants may move up to complete a senior team. Team members may only compete on one team. A team Youth Liability and Indemnity Form, signed by CEA/AST is due at time of entry.
- 4. AGE DIVISIONS: (as of September 1)
 - Junior: at least 8 years old and in the 3rd grade, but no more than 8th grade
 - Senior: must be in at least the 9th grade, but not older than 19 and in the 12th grade

5. CONTEST FORMAT/RULES OF PLAY:

- **a.** Teams must pre-build and program a robot prior to the competition.
- **b.** Teams will report to the designated location for check in and submit their robot and additional pieces/equipment for inspection.
- **c.** Each team will be directed to a team pit (one 6' or 8' table and chairs). Each pit will have access to electricity to power laptops and robot batteries.
- **d.** An orientation will be provided for all participants where show management will review the challenge, rules and scoring.
- **e.** The design of the game and designated number of challenges will be released in advance of the contest. There will be 3 to 4 additional unknown challenges revealed contest day, during orientation.
- f. Each team will have 1.5 hours for additional designing, building, programing, and testing of their robot.
- **g.** Teams will practice and compete on the same game table.
- h. If time permits, teams are allowed to make alterations to their robot design and/or program between matches.
- i. Teams must report immediately to the playing field when called.
- j. The robot must perform challenges autonomously.
- k. Only registered contestants and contest officials will be allowed in the pit Robot Challenge areas.
- I. Teams that may experience any equipment malfunction(s) may not replace the equipment with supplies outside the contest area (from leaders, volunteers, county extension agents or contest officials). Instead, team members must work together and be creative in completing preparation without the malfunctioning equipment or visit with other teams to borrow the needed part.

- **m.** Depending on the challenges, contest officials may provide non-Lego items that can be incorporated into the design of the robot.
- **n.** Coaches will be permitted to meet with their team for a 10-minute time period prior to Build Time. This time should be used to help team members develop a plan and foster positive youth development. Due to space limitations, there will not be a spectator area available until the finals.
- o. No cell phones or other types of communication devices are allowed in the pit or contest areas. Exceptions include the approved items listed in the Participant Rules. During Build Time and Robot Challenge, contestants are not allowed to communicate with anyone outside of the contest (coaches, parents, siblings, etc).
- **p.** A match will range between 1 and 3 minutes in length, depending upon the challenges designed for competition. The specific time limit will be noted in the game release document.
- **q.** Teams will have two preliminary matches in which to earn points. The sum score of the two matches plus the teamwork score will determine teams that qualify for the finals. The top 5 teams in each age division will advance to the final match. If there are fewer than 5 teams in an age division, no finals will take place. The total score from the preliminary matches (match + teamwork scores) will be used for preliminary placings.
- **r.** Finals will consist of two additional matches. The two match scores from the final round will be added to the total preliminary score. Finalist teams will be ranked based on their total scores. Judges' results are final.

- **4. FOOD CATEGORIES:** There will be four food categories in each age division: 1) Main Dish, 2) Fruits and Vegetables, 3) Bread and Cereal, or 4) Nutritious Snacks. Teams will be randomly assigned to a category, which will not be announced until check-in the day of the contest.
- **5. CONTEST FORMAT:** The contest consists of two parts: 1) Preparation and 2) Presentation. See Texas 4-H Food Challenge Guidelines for full contest format and rules.
- a. <u>PREPARATION</u>: Each team will be assigned a cooking station (one table). Teams will receive an information sheet with their contest category, "key" ingredient for that category, and "grocery store" list. No ingredient amounts, recipe, or instructions will be provided at the station. The "key" ingredient will be representative of one of the following categories: Appeizer, Main Dish, Side Dish, Healthy Dessert.
 - Each team will have 40 minutes to plan and prepare the dish using the key ingredient and selected "grocery store" items, develop a presentation, and clean up their cooking station.
 - Teams will have access to a "grocery store" of additional ingredients which should be combined with the "key" ingredient to create an original recipe/dish during the contest.
 - Teams must use at least two additional items from the "grocery store". "Grocery store" items will be "purchased" using a pricing system and "contest currency." This will enable teams to analyze the cost of their entire dish and individual serving. The currency system will be explained prior to the contest.
 - Each team will create an entire dish/recipe (not a full meal) using the provided key ingredient and "grocery store" items. Dishes/recipes created should include two or more servings. Teams should present the entire dish/recipe to the judges and communicate during their presentation what an individual serving size should be. Teams will be responsible for determining the number of servings their dish provides. Teams should not create side or multiple dishes with their ingredients/grocery store items.
 - Note cards may be used to write down the recipe that the team invents, along with notes related to nutrition, food safety and cost analysis. Teams should be exact on ingredients used, preparation steps, cooking time, temperature, etc.
 - All teams should be prepared to determine cost analysis for the entire recipe as well as the individual serving.
 Cost analysis will be based on key ingredient (price will be provided) and "grocery store" items used.
 - Teams are judged during the preparation portion of the contest. Teams should refer to the scorecard for judging criteria
 - Only participants and contest officials will be allowed in food preparation areas. Spectators may view the contest
 from designated areas if space and logistics allow; however, spectators should assume they will not be able to
 view the contest.
- **b.** <u>PRESENTATION:</u> After the 40-minute preparation time is complete, teams will be called to present their dish to a panel of at least two judges. To earn maximum points, teams must use the 5 minute presentation to address the following areas of the presentation scorecard: Knowledge of MyPlate, Nutrition Knowledge, Food Preparation, Safety Concerns, and Serving Size.
 - A majority of team members must participate in the presentation.

- · Judging time will include:
 - » 5 minutes for presentation
 - » 3 minutes for judges' questions
 - 2 minutes between team presentations for judges to score and write comments.
- Teams are allowed the use of note cards during the presentation but should not read from them, as this minimizes the effectiveness of their presentation.

- RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each contestant agrees to abide by the General and Youth Rules and Regulations of the State Fair of Texas as published in this exhibitor handbook and the following special rules.
- 2. **PURPOSE**: This contest is designed to challenge any youth currently in a wildlife study and enhance their education in the subject of wildlife species and wildlife habitat management.
- 3. ELIGIBILITY: Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA and 4-H members. Any contestant violating any rule will be disqualified from the contest. Teams must consist of members from the same county or chapter. Two (2) students constitute a team in this contest. Team scores will include the total of both team members. CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

- 1. RULES/REGULATIONS: Entries made in this department shall be subject to and each contestant agrees to abide by the General and Youth Rules and Regulations of the State Fair of Texas as published in this exhibitor handbook and the following special rules. Any coach or contestant who violates any of the rules of this contest will be barred from competing in future contests and their team will be disqualified for any awards.
- 2. ENTRY APPLICATION/FEES: Complete entry applications and a fee of \$150 per team and/or \$30 per individual must be submitted by entry deadline. All fees must accompany application for entry. Each college may enter either Junior or Senior College Divisions. Senior colleges may enter one team. Junior colleges may enter one Novice and one Professional team. There is no entry limitation on alternates. All entries must be signed and sent in together with one check by the team coach. Entries will NOT be accepted from other individuals. Late entries, submitted after September 1, will be accepted until the close of contest day Check-In. Late fees are double the original fee. For entry applications, visit bigtex.com/livestock
- 3. **ELIGIBILITY:** Junior colleges in the U.S. with agriculture departments are eligible to enter the junior contest divisions. Senior colleges in the U.S. which offer a degree in animal science are eligible to enter the senior contest division. The entry application must be signed officially by the team coach, certifying that all team members are eligible for entry in this contest. Each college will be permitted to enter one team in the senior division, or one team in each Junior division.

4. AGE DIVISIONS:

- a. **JUNIOR COLLEGE:** Each junior team will consist of 5 members and all 5 scores will count for the team total. Each team member is eligible for individual awards in their division. Junior college individual participants designated as alternates will be eligible for individual overall awards in their division. Contestants must be regularly enrolled in a Junior (2–year program) College and may not have credit for more than 66 semester hours or the equivalent. Contestants must have attended full-time the previous semester at the school from which they are competing, or not attended a Junior College the previous semester, in order to be eligible to compete. Students must have a 2.0 GPA on a 4 point scale to be eligible.
 - i. <u>Novice</u> Junior colleges may enter one (1) team in this division. Contestants entered in this division may be eligible to complete in the professional division in future contests. (Subject to other eligibility rules.)
 - **ii.** <u>Professional</u> Junior colleges may enter one (1) team in this division. Contestants entered in this division must not have competed in the junior college professional division in past years, and may be eligible to enter the senior college division in future contests.
- b. SENIOR COLLEGE: Each senior college may enter one (1) team consisting of 5 members and all 5 will count for the team total. Each team member is eligible for individual awards. Senior college individual participants designated as alternates will be eligible for individual overall awards. Contestants must be regularly enrolled in a senior college which offers a degrees in agriculture. Students who have participated as contestants in senior intercollegiate livestock judging contests of interstate or international character previous to January 1 are not eligible to enter this contest. Contestants must have been regularly enrolled in their respective colleges the previous semester and must not have served any time as an animal science instructor at any secondary school or college.

5. CONDUCT OF CONTESTANTS AND COACHES:

- No contestant or coach will be permitted to enter the show barns 24 hours prior to the contest.
- No contestant will wear any uniform, college colors, or will in any way signify to the judge his/her identity or the identity of the college represented.
- No smart watches or electronic devices are permitted at any time.
- While the contest is in progress, there is to be no conferring between contestants or anyone else, except as directed by the Superintendent or his representative.
- Coaches and alternates will not be permitted in the seats of the arena while the contest is in progress. Coaches and alternates may be permitted to see the classes after the judging is completed.
- **a. FAIR PLAY RULE:** Any contestant violating this code of conduct by cheating or other means is subject to point deductions and may be disqualified and/or ineligible to receive awards. One written warning may be given at the

discretion of a contest official or State Fair of Texas management.

2. CONTEST FORMAT:

- a. CLASS MAKEUP: Each class will consist of four animals. Animals within a class will be designated by numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4. The following classes will be judged: a total of four sheep/goat classes (any combination of market lamb classes, market goat classes, breeding sheep classes [fine wool or medium wool], and/or breeding goat classes); a total of four to five classes of cattle (any combination of market steer classes and/or breeding cattle classes); and a total of three to four swine classes (any combination of market and/or breeding hogs). When available, records may be used for evaluation of breeding classes. Actual class makeup is subject to change within the aforementioned list of classes.
- b. TIME: On each class of livestock, contestants will be allowed fifteen (15) minutes to make their observations, record their placings, and take such notes as will assist them in remembering the class when they appear before the judge. All groups will be notified two (2) minutes before the time is up. All contestants shall hand their cards bearing their number, class of animals, and placings, to the group leader immediately when called for. When final time is called, groups will change to other classes as directed by the Superintendent.
- c. ORAL REASONS: After placing all classes in the contest, the contestants will appear singly before a judge to give oral reasons substantiating their placings on certain classes. Each contestant will be allowed two (2) minutes to give reasons on each class. No contestant will be allowed to hold any paper or device of any kind that will assist in stating reasons to the judge. Seniors 8 sets, Junior Professionals 8 sets, and Junior Novice 6 sets.
- 3. SCORING: Scan sheets used for scoring will be provided by the Fair. Standard rules that apply to optical scanning should be followed (blacken only one bubble per class, completely blacken the bubble, avoid stray marks). Each contestant must provide their own #2 pencil and may bring a clipboard for use during the contest. Forms that are bent or abused will not be scored. Team number and contestant number are assigned at Check-In.
- **4. TIES:** Ties will be broken using species reasons scores, overall reasons scores and overall score when breaking ties within species. Ties within reasons will be broken by overall score and ties within overall score will be broken by overall reasons. Scores tied after application of these tie breakers will be broken by a method determined by contest officials. No duplicate awards will be given.

- 3. **ELIGIBILITY:** Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA and 4-H members who are a high school junior or senior (grade 11 or 12). IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED AT CHECK-IN (i.e. SCHOOL ID or DRIVER LICENSE). Any contestant violating any rule will be disqualified from the contest. Contestants must also have an entry in the current year's project show. Each contestant is required to return a Youth Liability and Indemnity Form.

4. CONDUCT OF CONTESTANTS:

- There will be no talking between contestants during the contest. Violating this rule may cause the contestants to be disqualified and ineligible to receive awards.
- Only contestants and contest officials will be permitted in the contest area during the contest.
- Contestants must have any and all contest materials (PPE, presentation handouts, etc) with them when they enter the contest area. Contestants leaving the contest area will not be admitted re-entry.
- No electronic devices will be allowed in contest area.

5. CONTEST FORMAT:

- **a. TEST:** multiple choice, covering general knowledge including, but not limited to: electricity, welding, machinery and equipment, engines, tool identification, structural systems and safety. The top scoring contestants will move on to participate in the skills demonstration and presentation. Other contestants will be excused.
- b. SKILL DEMONSTRATION: contestants will participate in a selected module to showcase their expertise in that particular skill. A list of possible modules is provided below. *Each participant must supply all industry standard personal safety equipment including proper footwear. - 2. ENTRY LIMITATION: Each contestant's supervising CEA/AST will be held responsible for ensuring the contestant is currently shooting under the direction of a certified coach. Entry applicants not participating in a program under the direction of a certified coach will not be permitted to compete. Only the first 120 entries between the two age divisions will be accepted. After 120 entries are received, additional entries will be placed on a waiting list subject to space availability. Late entries submitted after August 25, are subject to space availability; late fees are double the original fee. NO late entries will be accepted after Opening Day.
- **3. ELIGIBILITY:** Entries in this division are limited to Texas FFA and 4-H members. Each contestant is required to return a Youth Liability and Indemnity Form.

 - b. CLASSES: Contestants will compete in one of the below classes based upon what bow they will be shooting with.

 - Recurve
 - NASP
 - c. CONTEST PREPARATION: At check-in, contestants will be given identifiers in the form of a back number at check-in that must be displayed at all times while shooting. All equipment must be inspected at the time of check-in and before orientation. NO LATE ARRIVALS WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS! <u>Orientation is mandatory</u> for everyone who will participate in the event that day
 - **d. TOURNAMENT:** The tournament will begin promptly after the conclusion of orientation.
- 7. EQUIPMENT: Contestants must provide their own quivers. All bows must remain cased on the Fairgrounds until equipment inspection. Absolutely no sky drawing is allowed, no exceptions. This will be strictly enforced. Any contestants seen sky drawing will be immediately disqualified. All contestants or persons in charge of property, shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as the State Fair of Texas Livestock Show does not undertake to do so and shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property of contestants thereof. All contestants are responsible for security of their own property. The contestant is the absolute insurer of and is responsible for the condition of their property. The State Fair of Texas is not responsible for the acts of a third party.
- 8. RANGE SAFETY: The safety of all involved is of paramount importance. All range safety rules will be strictly enforced.

Any contestant failing to conform to safety standards will be warned or disqualified from the event. Minor infractions will be noted and marked on the contestant's badge. Repeated infractions or major safety violations will result in disqualification from the event.

9. FIELD & RANGE BOUNDARIES: For multiple reasons, control of traffic on and around the range is essential. Please respect these boundaries and the directions of the officials.

10. CONDUCT OF CONTESTANTS:

- Only contestants and contest officials will be permitted in the contest area during competition.
- If any contestant, in any way, whether in person or by agent, or servant, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows disrespect to them, to the show or competition, they are subject to be penalized. Management may demand a proper apology from the contestant, may exclude him/her from competition, bar him/her from the grounds, and may also withhold any prizes that may have been awarded.
- Participants are required to dress appropriately. Contestants must wear a shirt with sleeves. Eye and ear protection is required, and fully enclosed shoes must be worn.
- Only authorized persons are permitted to use two-way radios on the grounds. Any deliberate disruption of range communication by anyone at the event will be considered a safety violation and will be treated as such.
- **11. COACHING:** A participant may not be coached while on the shooting line. Coaching includes any communication between the coach, parent or other spectator and the contestant; verbal or non-verbal. The contestant may request assistance from the range safety officer and the range officer may assign an assistant.
- 12. SCORING: The double scoring system will be used. All participants will be involved in score keeping. All reported scores are checked for accuracy and corrections will be made when required. Contestant should be familiar with the double scoring system, and able to complete the scoring process without assistance. Shoot officials maintain the objective of producing timely, accurate and complete scoring records for each event. They do not represent any club, county, team, or individual. The shooting center, via the Shoot Coordinator, will be responsible for conducting any and all aspects of the event pertaining to "shooting". Including, but not limited to: squadding, scoring, posting of scores, determination of winners, and rule interpretation. Parents, coaches, observers and contestants should never have possession of scorecards.
- 13. APPEAL/PROTEST: A contestant may appeal a ruling on the field immediately if he/she feels a referee has missed a call. The scorer may poll the squad at his or her discretion. The decision of the referee on the field is final and not subject to further appeal. Parent/coach scoring is not official scoring and will not be consulted. Contestants may only protest any injustice, violation of the rules, or other circumstance that may have resulted in placing them at a disadvantage relative to other contestants. Such conditions must be reported to the field referee immediately.

SEMIFINAL ROUND

The top 30 contestants advancing to semi-finals will compete on contest day. Semi-finalists will be evaluated on the criteria below. Contestants may be divided randomly into groups for competition.

- **a.** <u>Application:</u> Contestants will complete have 20 minutes to complete application. Students should be prepared for the application to be electronic or hard copy. Only one submission is allowed. Contestants may use their cover letter and resume to complete the application.
- b. <u>Preliminary Interview:</u> Contestants should prepare for a ~10 minute interview, which may be in person, via phone or via video conference with their company's hiring manager(s). Interview order of contestants will be randomized. Judges will Evaluate:
 - » Contestant's introduction of themselves, which must include contestant's name and club or chapter, the title, description and source of the position applied for.

- **c.** <u>Follow Up Correspondence</u>: Following their interview, contestants will have 20 minutes to complete a form of correspondence, thanking the interviewers for the opportunity to apply to the position. Contestants will be given access to traditional office supplies, including a computer and printer. Only one submission is allowed. Contestants may use their cover letter and resume at this time.

The top scoring contestants based on their combined application, preliminarey interview, and follow up correspondence scores from each group will move to the final round.

FINAL ROUND

Finalists will participate in a secondary personal interview. The interview will be a maximum of 10 minutes in length and take place with a panel of three judges. This interview score will be added to the total of all initial scores. Finalists will compete for Grand and Reserve Champions and 3rd-6th placings, unless otherwise announced.

- All contestants will be administered a multiple choice written exam. This exam will cover general knowledge including, but not limited to: industry knowledge, breeds and genetics, and management practices.
 Scantrons will be utilized. Thirty minutes will be allotted to complete the exam.
- All contestants will participate in the skills demonstration or identification stations which may entail or relate
 to: live animal evaluation, animal husbandry practices, or consumer knowledge. Five to fifteen minutes will
 be alotted at each station depending on degree of difficulty for a total of 90 minutes.

b. FINAL ROUND

- JUNIORS- The top 5 scoring contestants will advance to an additional set of skill stations.
- INTERMEDIATES/SENIORS- The top 10 scoring contestants will advance to a final round of skill stations and an interview/thought question panel on swine industry knowledge and issues.
